THREE TITLES AT THE SLOUGH SPORTS AWARDS



Cippenham Table Tennis Club was confirmed as one of the leading sporting organisations in Slough at the Borough's Annual Sports Awards on 16th March. Of the eleven awards open to nomination the Club was successful in winning three and was nominated in four others.

For the fourth year running the Club itself won an award, this time the Community Club of the Year. The citation for this presentation included references to the Club's work around the borough and especially at the Arbour Vale special needs school. Given this, it was appropriate that it was Jan Chapman, who along with Ken Phillips coaches weekly at the school, who was chosen by the Club to receive the award.

Ken himself was given the Coach of the Year award for the second time, completing a unique hat-trick of simultaneous honours which include also the ETTA Male Coach of the Year and NCF Voluntary Coach of the Year in an Individual Sport.

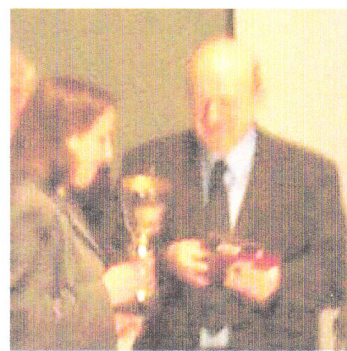

News in Short

England call-up for Myles

Myles Evans, at the age of 9, is the latest of Cippenham's young stars to gain international recognition. Myles has been selected to appear for England Schools in the forthcoming British Primary Schools International.

This is the Club's 17th Slough League championship and 8th in succession (both of which are records). St. Michaels 2nd at Nationals

A team of Cippenham players (Jonathan Sargent; Myles Evans; Alexander Lovell; Gavin Evans), representing St. Michael's School, Bracknell, finished second in the recent National Finals of the English Schools Table Tennis Association Championships. Myles and Gavin were unbeaten throughout. Last year the same team, supplemented by Bradley Evans, went one better to win the national title.

Thomas' Title, James Also Inspires

Top seed Thomas Mitchell provided the host club with another champion at the Cippenham Cadet 3 Star Open Championships on 25th March. Tom had an easy ride through the qualifying group and the following rounds and was never extended until he met Cippenham club mate James Milton in the final. James (12) shocked his older opponent by taking the first game at deuce but in the end Thomas' superior power and greater experience bore fruit. The Boys' Singles was a successful event all round for Cippenham with Gavin Evans surpassing all expectations to reach the semi-final. Gavin is undoubtedly the hottest young talent in English table tennis and is a star performer even at a club rich with talent at the younger age groups. Amazingly, Gavin won his group and then defeated Andrew O'Mahony (Beds) 21-19 in the third, Shaun Robertson (Surrey) 21-11, 21-15 then Oliver Young (Bucks) 24-22 in the third before succumbing to Thomas in the semi. This bright young star is just seven years of age, playing opponents from all over the south of England up to seven years older.

The other semi-final saw James beat Jaz Allen-Sutton (Warks) who had upset the seedings one round earlier by defeating the host club's David Hayes. Other Cippenham players who reached the last 16 were Myles Evans (aged 9) and Sam Harrison, while David Harris, Joe Misseldine, Andrew Dickens, Sebastian Bielec and Prabdeep Panesar also qualified from their groups.

If Cippenham dominated the Boys' Singles event then Peniel Academy (Brentwood) did likewise in the Girls' Singles. The final was

between the third and fourth seeds with Lucy Weil defeating Bethany Rees 21-15 in the third. Lucy had eliminated her top-seeded sister Emma one round earlier while Rees had had a close victory over second seed Anusha Seneviratne (Kent). Cippenham's last survivors were Rebecca Tweedy, Sylvana Bielec and Caroline Linz who all fell in the quarters. In addition Jenny Hansell and Eleanor Tweedy qualified from their preliminary round groups.

Two of Cippenham's young starlets brought back medals from the Italian Cadet Open at the beginning of March. Joanna Parker, representing England U14 won a silver medal in the Cadet Girls' Team event and a bronze in the Cadet Girls' Doubles. She also reached the quarter-final of the Cadet Girls' Singles.

11-years old Bradley Evans won two bronze medals, in the MiniCadet (U12) Boys' Team event and the U12 Boys' Singles.

Both Jo and Bradley are firmly established as the best players in England at their age level and gained valuable international experience from the trip to Rome.

So Close, Bucks

A Buckinghamshire team, full of Cippenham players, came so close to winning the County Championships Junior Premier Division at the end of March. In the end a 5-5 last-ditch draw with Surrey was only enough for second place but this was still an excellent performance from the team in its first season at the top level. Bucks led Surrey 3-1 and 4-2 and had they managed the magical 6-4 scoreline would have become national champions. Ironically, it was another Cippenham player, Joanna Parker, representing Surrey, that denied Bucks this accolade by beating Gemma Chapman in a storming match that went the full distance.

On Saturday Bucks beat Warwickshire 8-2 and drew 5-5 with Yorkshire. Sunday morning saw an impressive 7-3 win over Cheshire with the pivotal match being Emily Tucker's startling two-straight win over England cadet international Karen Shepherd. Despite only coming second Bucks went through the entire season of seven matches undefeated.

Next season only Robert Hansell is over-age leaving Bradley Evans, Warren Brooks, Gemma and Emily along with one or two of the other ever-improving Cippenham youngsters with the task to try to go one better and win the championship.

Mike Also Close

Top seed Dave Harding from Surrey was the worthy winner of the Men's Singles title at the Cippenham Veterans' 2 Star Open Championships on 11th March. After getting past Cippenham member Maurice Isaacs in his semi-final he had to face another player from the host club in the final. Mike Rhodes had excelled in surpassing his fifth seeded position to defeat second seed Steve Davis in the quarter-final and third seed Derek Holman in the semi. Earlier on Mike had beaten his Buckinghamshire county team mate Ken Philipson while Maurice's route to the semi included defeating his Cippenham Super League teammate and fourth seed Karl Bushell in the preliminary round groups. Karl did, however, still qualify from his group and eventually beat eighth seed Tom Adams but lost to Holman in the quarter-final. Holman also had a scare in the last 16 where he won only after being 19-all in the third with Cippenham's Tim Heaps.

There was also local success in the Women's Singles where Jackie Wood justified her seeding in reaching the final. However, she had to do it the hard way by beating top seed Gill Larking in the semi. Larking had lost in her group to Kim Johnson from Wales who eventually went all the way to collect the title.
