It was another successful weekend for Cippenham's two men's teams as the Veterans' British League season concluded at Derby. Building on from strong performances in the first weekend back in September, the first team finished third in Division 1A while the second team went one better and secured the runners-up medals in Division 4B, earning promotion to Division 3 for next season.

First team captain Martin Adams had an especially fruitful weekend, winning nine of his ten matches and was well backed up by Mark Banks, who won seven, and Martin Gray, who won six. As a team they won three of their five matches and drew the other two.

The first team started by beating Redlands Bats 4-2 in a close and competitive match and then swept aside Border Reivers 6-0 on Saturday afternoon. However, divisional champions Norwich were a different prospect in the later match and Neil Charles inflicted on Martin Adams his only defeat of the weekend as the match was drawn 3-3 with all three Cippenham players con-

tributing to the scoreline.

The match that ultimately decided between second and third place was played on Sunday morning. Martin Adams was again in great form as he beat both David Buck and Hari Gehlot and Mark Banks beat former Cippenham player Steve Buck. However, Martin Gray lost to both of the Buck brothers and the match was drawn 3-3. The weekend concluded with another 6-0 romp over Topspin Fusion. However, the match was not as one-sided as might first appear as Cippenham won three sets close in the deciding game.

Division 4B started with three teams locked on eight points at the top of the division and the matches that were important in deciding the medal positions were played out between these three with the Cippenham second team playing both the other two protagonists on Sunday. Saturday's matches, against the three teams in the lower half of the table, were all won. Drax were the first to suffer at Cippenham's hands, being beaten 5-1 on Saturday morning. Ilfracombe Pirates put up a little more resis-

The crunch came on Sunday morning against Foresters D. The pivotal game came right at the start of play with Christos Hannides losing 3-2 to Alex Rorke. Mike Rhodes equalised for Cippenham against Roger Pingram and later Christos got the better of Daniel Lucking but this was not enough as Foresters ran out 4-2 winners.

The final match of the weekend, on Sunday afternoon, would decide second and third positions. Cippenham went into match having dropped to third place following the defeat in the morning and needed to beat Bristol Associates if they were to secure the runnersup position. Mike got Cippenham off to the perfect start, beating Mark Farrow 3 -0 but Anthony Briscoe responded for Bristol against Christos. Then followed a run of three sets that determined the final outcome. All three sets went to a deciding fifth games and all were ultimately won by Cippenham. Simon Vine was responsible for two of these against Mike Bishop and Farrow while, sandwiched in between. Mike Rhodes came back from 2-0 to score a great win over Briscoe. It mattered little that Christos lost the final set to Bishop as Cippenham had won 4-2 and secured second place in the division.

Meanwhile, the Cippenham ladies team were not having such a great time and never threatened to pull away from bottom place in Division 1. There were two matches to complete the division table before it was split into a top and a bottom half. Wheelers Fusion won the first of these 6-0 and then Ashford triumphed 5-1. After the split, Cippenham had to play Ashford again and the same scoreline prevailed and then Fusion won 6-0 on Sunday morning, despite three of the six sets requiring a deciding game. The final match of the weekend did provide some respite and a point in a 3-3 drawn with Northern Belles with Julie Dean, Sue Hayes and Denise Weller all contributed one win apiece.

nother poor weekend of results saw both Cippenham teams finish bottom of their divisions in the Women's British League. However, both teams improved on their performances from the first weekend in October, but both seem doomed to be relegated to lower divisions next season.

The one bright spot for the first team, playing in Division 3, came in the match on Sunday morning against third-placed Sycamore. A heavy defeat in October was reversed in the return fixture with Cippenham running out winners 4-2. Denis Weller was the star for Cippenham, beating both Lisa Lewis and Amber Zygadio while Sycamore's two sets were both won by Maria Lebedeva as she beat Sue Hayes and Wendy Porter.

Saturday's matches had seen three consecutive 5-1 defeats to Burton Uxbridge 2, Fusion III and Cardiff City. However, Denise again performed well and won one of her two singles in all three of these matches.

The weekend concluded with another defeat, this time 4-2 against Halton 3. Despite being on the losing side, Sue Hayes picked up the player of the match award for her wins over Rachael Scott and Molly Hancock.

The young second team started with a 6-0 defeat at the hands of Division 4 champions Milton Keynes Vixens. Next came the only point won during the weekend in a 3-3 draw with Cliffdale Chandlers. It was a real team performance with all three girls picking up a win apiece. Jemma Walker got Cippenham off to a great start by beating Kris Sumner, then Lucie Bouron opened her account for the season against Alex Robinson. 2-1 became 2-3 before Shristi Ghosh secured the point for the

ippenham TTC ran a highly successful open tournament at the end of February. The Cippenham Five by Two Senior and Veterans' 1-Star Open was supported by players from across the south and midlands and from Wales, resulting in a maximum forty-five entries for each of the two events.

Two new winners emerged as previous champions were eliminated one by one.

The day commenced with the veterans' events. Multi-times champion Martin Gunn was the first of the favourites to lose. He lost his very first match in the preliminary round group. However, it turned out that his conqueror was a former Philippines international in the shape of Julious Esposo. The first two games were shared, both by deuce scores, but then Esposo showed his prowess by pulling away to win 3-1. Third seed Jojo Senorin was next to fall. He lost to Henry Arthur and, after a three-way tie was calculated, found himself in third position and out of the championship event and into the consolation. Another of the top players, Pat Glynn was beaten by Hiroshi Furuta but this was not terminal for Glynn as he finished runner-up in the group and still qualified for the championship event. Maidenhead player Mark Banks was also expected to win his group but he also had to be content with runner-up as he lost to Chris Maiden.

And so into the competition proper. Julious Esposo, now occupying the place at the top of the draw made serene progress, showing his undoubted class throughout. He accounted for Raj Singh, Alex Aston and Pat Glynn without dropping a game. Defending champion Steve Davis was a victim of the



penholder style of Glynn in the quarterfinals. Martin Gunn's run was ended by Rory Scott while Mike Browne, who had lost to Samson Bekele at the group stage, progressed to the semi-final by beating Phil Snelson.

Hari Gehlot's progress in to the final was spectacular. His first match in the knock-out stage was against his Cookham Social team-mate Mark Banks. Gehlot won this in a canter but then had to come back from 2-1 to defeat Rory Scott in the quarters. He then eased past Mike Browne in the semi-final to set up a final against Esposo. Gehlot battled bravely and took the third game but in the end was no match for the former Philippines player.

The Veterans' Consolation was won, not surprisingly, by Jojo Senorin although he did have to fight back from 2-1 down against Gary Keers in the semifinal. Cippenham's Paul Baker awaited Senorin in the final but went down 3-1.

Half of the veteran players stayed on for the Open Singles in the afternoon and pitted their skills against younger contenders. All the top four seeds came through their groups comfortably, but that was not the case for the next highest ranked players. In Group 6, Mohammad Owadally lost in five games to the veterans' champion Julious Esposo, Jojo Senorin lost out to Vadym Krevs while Steve Davis succumbed to Sam Ricks.

Sam Ricks then went on a great run that saw him beat Jacob Goss and Martin Gunn to take his place in the semifinals alongside the seeds Federico Viterbo, Pat Glynn and Chris Bush. Jojo Senorin, winner of the veterans' consolation in the morning beat the veterans' champion Julious Esposo in the first round, a reversal in form if there ever was one. At the same stage Phil Snelson got the better of Steve Davis and Rory Scott eliminated Mohammad Owadally.

The quarter-final provided four top class matches. Two of these required a deciding game as Sam Ricks defeated Martin Gunn and Pat Glynn put out Phil Snelson. Federico Viterbo eliminated Rory Scott and Chris Bush got through Senorin, both in four games. Bush's next two games were much quicker as he first beat Glynn in the semi-final and then reversed the seeding against Viterbo in the final itself.

The consolation event was won by Joseph Goss who beat Akash Shah in the final.
