In a top quality final group Simon beat Steve Smith 11-9 in the fifth game of a match that swung one way and then the other. Simon also beat Ricky Hardcastle 3-0 while Steve defeated Ricky 3-1.

The earlier stage 1 group matches had been keenly contested. In group A Steve Smith and Hari Vennapusa both beat Graham Trimming in five games while in Group B Ricky got through despite suffering a surprise 3-2 defeat against Sebastian. Elroy Hull beat Sebastian 3-0 and Ricky beat Elroy also 3-0 and so Ricky progressed into the top group while Elroy had to play off for placed 4 to 6. In Group C Simon Wilde won both his matches 3-1 including a clash with his Cippenham Saxons teammate Albert Cheung while Albert only just got home 11-9 in the fifth against new member Simon Vine.

## **Team Open attracts maximum entry**

maximum entry of 24 teams battled it out on 12 January in the Cippenham Team 2-Star Open Championship. This is a unique event for teams of two players and featuring a progressive rather than straight knockout format after the preliminary round groups,

The preliminary round groups went almost according to plan. Stumpede, a team consisting of current and hopeful Paralympians, were the only seeds that failed to top their group and that was hardly a surprise as they came up against a formidable Welsh duo in Scared Hitless.

Stumpede showed good value for their seeding by finishing ninth while Scared Hitless rose up the ranks to fifth after an exciting final match in which they de-

feated their Welsh rivals Oh What's Occurrin', a team comprising regulars Julie Furber and Claire Flannagan.

OLOP IMPACT and Fusion both reached the final by winning all their matches 2-0. The score was 1-1 when Daniel Moses prevailed 11-6, 11-5, 15-13 over Jamal Dennison to take the title a short distance down the M4 to Our Lady of Peace club in Earley.

Tony Stead and Steve Smith, two members of the Cippenham second team and masquerading as RAF & R.A.F. were the best of the locals finishing in seventh place. The "future of Cippenham", to quote Head Coach Ken Phillips, was also on show and the four youngsters acquitted themselves really well gaining valuable experience in the process. Team Ganador, comprising Jemma Walker and Megan Ashfield, finished fourteenth while Team Survivor, Ben Naylor-Smith and Shristi Ghosh, were one place lower. At the other end of the age scale a team comprising newly-weds Dave and Elena Tant finished seventeenth, top of the bottom section of eight teams.

# **Both teams consolidate their positions**

The second and third weekends have both taken place since the last Newsletter.

#### Second weekend

Both Cippenham teams had encouraging results in the Senior British League at the second weekend and both moved one place up their respective league tables. The first team gained five points out of eight and moved from fourth to third in Division 1 South while the second team gained four points and that was enough to move them from sixth to fifth in Division 3 South.

The first team started the weekend in a dominant mood, sweeping bottom team Crusaders away 8-0.

Saturday afternoon's match was more of a contest with Cippenham beating York Gardens I 6-2. Mark was named player of the match as he set the standard for Cippenham with 3-0 victories against both Chris Bush and Khaled Alotaibi. However, it was the latter two who gained York Gardens their consolation wins as Owe suffered his only defeat of the weekend against Alotaibi and Martin Adams fell 3-1 to Bush. Martin Gray also maintained his 100% record thus far for the weekend.

Sunday offered a different perspective with matches against the teams placed first and second in the division and Cippenham having to draft in reserves from the second team to replace their unavailable captain Martin Adams. In the morning match against second-placed Bournemouth Sports, Cippenham made a dream start and when Owe had beaten Bournemouth number one Stephen Foster 3-1 and Mark had seen off the challenge of Nathan Bingham 3-2, the host team found themselves 2-0 up. However, that quickly became a 3-2 deficit before Owe completed his brace with a 3-2 win over Hugo Pang and the free-flowing Martin Gray overcame Nathan Bingham 3-0. How-

ever, with the score 4-3, Bradley King was unable to secure the second point when he gave player of the match Chloe Thomas her second 3-0 victory.

Owe Karlsson completed a memorable debut weekend, in which he won seven of his eight matches, when beating both David Barr and Federico Viterbo against Kingfisher in the final match. However, none of his teammates were able to join in the points scoring and Cippenham finished off on the wrong side of a 6-2 scoreline against their local rivals from Earley.

The second team, also playing at Cippenham, got off to a great start with a hard-fought 6-2 victory over Horsham II. Only Simon Dilkes, who beat both Paul Baker and Bradley King, came between Cippenham and the whitewash that would have matched the first team's opening round performance, but in truth the score could have been closer. Tony Stead was man of the match as he beat both Harry Collins and Tony Catt while, with the score at 4-2 Paul Baker beat Catt 11-9 in the deciding game to secure the win for Cippenham and then Steve Smith followed this up with 11-8 in the fifth against Collins.

The celebrations were short-lived as Cippenham II then fell to a surprising 7-1 defeat against Generation 2 in the afternoon. Only Bradley King, who beat Daniel Lucking 3 -0, stemmed the tide against a Fareham-based team who included former Cippenham mainstay Mike Rhodes in their ranks.

Sunday started in the same vein with a 7-1 defeat at the hands of Fusion III who won all their matches over the weekend. Ricky Hardcastle score Cippenham's only point with an 11-9 fifth game success against Jack Merton.

The final match, though, had a dif-

ferent complexion as a revitalised Cippenham side beat York Gardens IV 5-3, leapfrogging over their opponents in the league table in the process. Bradley was the star of the show, beating both Marios Michaelides and Craig Brown while Tony also beat Michaelides and Steve and Paul both beat Murray Wilson.

#### Third weekend

There were mixed results for the Cippenham teams in the third weekend of the Senior British League on Sunday. A weakened first team managed only one point from four yet managed to hold on to third position in Division 1 South while the second team gained two points yet slipped one place to sixth in Division 3 South. Both teams can approach the final weekend of matches in March with the comfort of knowing that they will almost certainly retain their places in the same divisions for next season.

With only three of their squad of players available, the first team had to call up Anthony Gardner for their first match on Sunday morning. The absence of a fourth regular member of the squad made a difference as all three regulars won one of their two matches in a 5-3 defeat at the hands of Greenhouse II. They all won against the player ranked one place below them in the opponents' ranks. Mark Scutts, Cippenham's number one, got the better of Greenhouse number two Chris Lewis, while Owe Karlsson beat Sherwin Remata and captain Martin Adams beat Curtis Welsh.

Meanwhile, the other side of the hall the Cippenham second team ran up a 6-2 victory over basement team Urban II with all three of Cippenham's "local" players bagging a brace. Bradley King, playing at the top of the order, was the player to lose out, not playing anything near his best and succumbing to Tommy Gritton after winning the first two games. Tony Stead was named

Anthony and Bradley swapped teams for the afternoon's matches in an attempt to gain extra momentum for the first team's encounter with Godalming Coversure whilst the second team viewed their match against divisional leaders Property Street with less expectation. They were right with that as Property Street ran out easy 8-0 victors with only three of the sets being extended even to a fourth game.

The first team, though, made a great start to their match with Owe beating Michael Chan from two games down and Mark beating Alain Choo-Choy 3-0 to put Cippenham 2-0 up. Godalming hit back three times to reverse the lead but Cippenham responded again. Owe and Martin Adams beat Alex Forshaw and Choo-Choy respectively, both 3-0 to put Cippenham 4-3 ahead but in the final set Bradley was easily outplayed by Andreas Pusch and Cippenham had to settle for one point from a 4-4 draw.

In Group 2, Neil Wright was the seed to lose and fittingly it was to the event's organiser Paul Baker. Paul went on to win this group. The other two groups followed the form guide with Mark Banks and Martin Gray comfortably easing through.

Senorin may have lost twice in his group but the top seed was warmed up for the knock-out stages. A win over Martin Gray 3-2 earned him a place in the semi-finals where he defeated Paul Baker. The final saw Mark Banks pitted against Senorin. Banks led 2-1 at one stage and the Cookham Social player looked set to claim the title. However, when Banks ran out of steam in the decider Senorin took full advantage.

In the afternoon's Senior Singles event Senorin was again up to his old tricks. The second seed was beaten by Ed Slot in his group. Fourth seed Martin Gray also fell, beaten by Mohammed Owadally. Top seed Federico Viterbo and third seed Neil Wright both emerged from their groups with their records intact although Wright was made to work hard by Cippenham's Simon Wilde who led the Welshman 2-1 at one stage.

All four seeded players qualified for the knock-out event in the top half of the draw with three of them in the second quarter. Jojo Senorin won the fight for this semi-final place by eliminating Martin Gray and Neil Wright. He met his match in the semi-final, though, against top seed Federico Viterbo.

The bottom half of the draw, devoid of seeds, was open for anyone to come through. Mohammed Owadally was unable to take advantage as, after beating Martin Gray in the groups. he was eliminated by Martin's brother Kevin. The player who emerged in the final was Billy Ho.

The final, though, proved too much for Ho and the power of Viterbo saw the Italian player from the Old Gordonians club take the title after four fast and furious games.


