Slough Individual Handicap Finals

Jeremy Bateman retained his Lynford Bowl title at the Slough's League handicap finals, beating Cippenham Buccaneers team-mate Clive Perry in the final. The women's Wharton Vase event was won by Catherine Hayes who overcame her mother Sue Hayes in the final.

British Primary Schools Champs

Cippenham's Evans brothers Bradley (aged 11) and Myles (aged 9) were both unbeaten as England won the British Schools Primary Championships. They both won all eight singles against Scotland, Wales, Ireland and Guernsey. For good measure Bradley also retained his Boys' Singles title, the only player ever to do so.

Exit from Ormesby Cup

Cippenham made an exit from the Ormesby Cup, the national club championship, on 7th April. The host club lost both matches in the second stage, losing 5-1 to Farnham Central (Aldershot) and 5-0 to a very strong Ifeld (Crawley/Horsham) team. Graham Trimming got Cippenham off to a great start with a 21-18 in the third win over Terry Osborne in the first match but after that it was all downhill with Mike Rhodes and Robert Hansell unable to contribute to the scoreline.

More Success at the National Junior and Cadet Masters

Gold For Jo; Silver For Brad

ippenham's Joanna Parker and Bradley Evans both won medals after superb performances at the National Cadet (U14) Masters tournament over the weekend of 31st March and 1st April. At this prestigious tournament, played at their home club, Jo justified her top billing by winning the gold medal in the girls' event while Bradley surpassed all expectations by taking the silver in the boys'.

Jo went through the entire weekend unbeaten, winning all of her thirteen matches. On the Saturday she was troubled only once, being extended to a third game by Yorkshire's Nicola White, to top the first stage group. The top six from each of the two groups were invited back on the Sunday and again Jo was supreme, although Lauren Springthorpe (Lincs) did take a game. The final match of the event produced a show-down between Jo and Abigail Embling (Essex) with the winner to take the title. Embling's heavily looped attack proved too powerful for the defensive tactics of Jo in the first game and the Cippenham player found herself having to come back from a game down. Despite going 4-0 down in the second game, Jo came back, gradually chiselling away at her opponent and took the next two games and the title 21-16, 21-15.

If Jo's success was anticipated, Bradley's was not. Going in to the tournament ranked only seventh of the sixteen competitors, he excelled to be judged first in a three-way tie for second place. Warwickshire's Greg Baker was head and shoulders ahead of his opponents and won all of his matches two-straight to take the title in style. The real race was played out for second place. At the finish, Bradley, Chris Gregory (Shropshire) and Adam Bleakley (Lancs) had all won ten of their thirteen matches and had all won one and





lost one against each other in the matches that decided the tie-breaker. However, Bradley's two-straight win over Gregory and 21-19 in the third loss to Bleakley gave him the edge and the silver medal. The future is rosy for the current England U11 champion who has two more years left in the cadet age

Ironically, it was Bleakley's first match loss to Cippenham's David Hayes that had denied the Lancashire player second place outright. David also had an exceptional tournament into which he started as the lowest ranked player. He won six matches and will surely be listed higher in the next national ranking list as a consequence.
