TWO OUT OF THREE AIN'T BAD!




With apologies to Meat Loaf!

Two of Cippenham's three teams in the Woolwich Junior British League lead their divisions at the half way stage. All three teams performed up to and beyond expectations in the first half fixtures at Kettering during the weekend 10/11th October.

Pride of place must go to the girls' team who, seeded to come fifth in Division 1, lead the way by one point after the first series of matches. Only a drawn match, 3-3, with second placed Grove "B" denied the local girls a 100% record. Humber-side, Spicer Girls and Dumfries were all beaten 4-2 while BATTS suffered 5-1 at the hands of the Cippenham girls. All three girls excelled, especially Jane Dickens who has so often flattered to deceive in the past. Jane's record of eight wins from ten matches will surely carry her well up the national rankings and for Emma Human, three of her five wins were each worth a maximum ranking points bonus. Cippenham's number one, 12-year old Gemma Chapman, again proved what a good player she is for her age, leading the team with seven wins from ten starts. A similar performance from the girls in the second series of matches at Hopton-on-Sea in February would clinch promotion to the Premier Division.

Cippenham's boys' first team already have a place in their Premier Division. This team was not expected to be amongst the pacemakers in the division and their record of only two defeats along with three drawn matches to finish in fourth place was very satisfactory. England number ten Martin Rule led the team and won four of his ten matches, a similar record to debutant

Stephen Beerling. Nicholas Wilson weighed in with three victories. Draws were gained against Irish Boys, Peniel and Edmonton "A" while defeats were suffered at the hands of Challoner Hall (2-4) and Grove "A" (0-6).

Meanwhile the Cippenham boys' second team were ploughing through the field in Division 2a, drawing their final match with Halton, and beating Berrymans 4-2, Challoner Hall "B" and Spicer Boys both 5-1 and Oakbank 6-0. Marc Gilston won all six of his matches while Robert Hansell tasted defeat just once in eight. Douglas Speed and England U12 champion Warren Brooks both won five out of eight. The final match with Halton was an epic with Cippenham clawing back from 0-2 down to draw 3-3 and so preserve a two point lead over their opponents at the top of the table. Here's to a repeat performance at Potters in February!



Not Quite, Martin!

Cippenham's Martin Adams came close to bringing off a shock victory in the Cippenham 2-Star Open Championships on 25th October. Martin, signed by Cippenham this season to spearhead the team in Division 2 of the British League, sensationally defeated the number one seed, Abdul Wuraola, in the quarter-final and then fourth seed Chris Beckley in the semi. In both of these matches Martin had to repair the damage of a first game defeat to win both 21-16 in the third game. However, in the final Martin could not quite match the firepower of defending champion Michael Auchterlonie, of Reading, and lost in two close games.

The next most successful of the Cippenham players in the Men's Singles was Kimber Choda who, after winning his group, dismissed the challenges of Paul Savage and Mike Levene before losing out to Auchterlonie in the semi-final. After being runner-up in his group to Auchterlonie, Cippenham's Mike Rhodes had a good win over Dave Crowley before succumbing to the top seed Wuraola, ranked 46 in England.

In the Women's Singles, the home club's top seed Sue Collier had a disappointing event, losing to Rose Rainton in her semi-final. Rainton went on to lose to Marianna Rolikova in the final.

There were good performances from local players in the consolation events. Both Steve Joel and Sue Hayes reached the final of their respective competitions, Steve losing out to Gavin West while Sue was beaten by Sarah Horsnell. In the Men's consolation Martin Rule also reached the semi-final before he, too, lost to West.

The Cippenham Boys "C" team dominated the first session of the Woolwich National Junior League at Cippenham on 24th October. John Camilleri was unbeaten while Ben Beveridge lost only once and Daniel Jacobs twice as the team amassed 33 points from a possible 36 to lead the initial twelve team section by eight clear points. In the same competition the "E" team lie sixth.

In the girls' competition Cippenham teams lie second, third and eighth in a nine team format. Rebecca Eldridge and Claire Smart were unbeaten for the "B" team while Joanna Parker won six out of eight. Hannah Stone also returned 75% for the "C" team. Both teams have a match in hand over Progress who lead the division by five points.

In the lower boys' section, played at Chesham High School, Cippenham's "E" and "F" teams lie third and ninth out of eleven. Jonathan Attenborough won nine of his ten matches, Paul Zeun eight and James Milton six.

This was the first of four sessions of the WNJL. All three sections (two boys, one girls) will be split into two after the second session when all teams will have played one another and these results will be carried forward.

One-to-one Coaching

From November there will be a new system for juniors to book one-to-one coaching sessions with Ken and some of the other coaches.

A timetable of available hourly slots on Tuesday and Thursday evenings will be posted on the notice board a week in advance. In the first instance we would ask you to only request a single hour in any fortnightly period to ensure that everyone gets a fair chance. This may change once we establish the level of demand.
