Jo's absence a blow in Junior British League title challenge

MIXED FORTUNES AT NORWICH

There were mixed fortunes for Cip penham's teams at the Junior British League during the weekend of October 12/13th. All four teams performed to expectations with the girls' second team being the most successful. The girls' first team were hampered by the non-availability of star player Joanna Parker who was making her European League debut for the senior England team at Vilnius, Lithuania.

In the end the Cippenham "A" team had to settle for third place at the half-way stage in the Girls' Premier Division after suffering defeats at the hands of Grove "A" and Team Peniel "A". The Peniel match was lost 4-2 with Cippenham's wins coming from Gemma Chapman and Karen Shepherd. Gemma Yarnley, deputising for Joanna, lost a set 3-2 to Sarah Brown in what proved to be the difference between no points and one point. Grove were inspired by Chinese import Zhao Shuang and the Market Drayton club's 5-1 win in this match was replicated against each one of their four other opponents.

Better results came from Cippenham's other three matches. The weekend commenced with a 4-2 win over Wirral with Gemma Chapman winning twice and Karen and Gemma Yarnley both once. Then followed a 5-1 win over Scotland with only Gemma Yarnley losing and a 6-0 drubbing of the Seasiders of Blackpool.

Led by a superb performance from Emily Tucker, who lost only once to head the division averages, the girls' second team

went through the weekend unbeaten even though they could only draw three of their four matches. The weekend started with a 3-3 draw with Darlington "A". Emily won two in this match and Rebecca Tweedy, on British League debut, won the other. This was followed up with a 5-1 thrashing of Team Peniel "B". Emily and Francesca Parnell both bagged a brace for Cippenham with Rebecca winning once. The 3-3 draw against Irish Girls was a real team effort, all three girls winning once in a match where Emily suffered her only defeat to the Irish number one. Emily again won twice in the final match, another 3-3 draw with Grove "B", and again it was Rebecca who supplied the all important third set.

The boys' team, although only in fourth place, on sets aggregate, in Division 1 are only one point adrift from the runners-up position. David Hayes played well throughout and was only beaten once but the other players must have

been disappointed with their form. Robert Lemon, who has an extraordinary record in the senior British League, could only find the winning post twice as could James Milton, who tried hard but was a little off form. Chris Hansell won only one of his six matches. Nevertheless. the weekend started well with a 4-2 win over Darlington "A". Robert's two wins came in this match and they were matched with a brace from David. It all went sour in the second match, however, as, with David rested, Cippenham suffered a 5-1 reverse to Devon Aces with only James getting on the scoresheet. Saturday finished with a 3-3 draw with Team Peniel "A" with Chris adding to two wins from David. Sunday saw mixed fortunes as the morning brought a 5-1 defeat by Scotland, with only David on the scoresheet, then the afternoon produced a 4-2 win over Irish Boys. David won twice, James once and Robert was awarded a walkover.

Cippenham Table Tennis Club's continuing place as one of the major clubs in English table tennis was confirmed when the Club was presented with yet another award. This season it was third place nationally in the PremierClub of the Year awards at Excellence level. Having won the award in both 1996 and 1997, Cippenham has been at the forefront of the sport since the opening of the £520,000 Cippenham Table Tennis Centre in 1996. Last season Cippenham were given second prize and the competition is stiff this year's winners, Ellenborough TTC (Enfield) went on to win the coveted CCPR national award, and the £10,000 prize money that went with it, in competition with 80 entrants from all other sports.

The award was presented to Club Secretary and Founder Graham Trimming and other members of the Club by English Table Tennis Association Chairman Alan Ransome OBE. The citation praised the skilled and dedicated management team that runs the Club and which has developed a comprehensive activity programme. The occasion was the ETTA Southern Region conference "Recruit and Prosper" staged at Cippenham TTC and The Westgate School at which speakers from the ETTA and Sport England enthused an audience of thirty delegates on the merit of the Volunteer Investment Programme and associated topics.

Top Seeds Successful at Senior Open

Top seeds Ritchie Venner and Michele Cohen fully justified their rankings by winning the main titles at the Cippenham 2-Star Open Championships on 20th October. The entry of 100 players was the largest yet for a senior tournament at Cippenham and drew players from all over the south of England, the Midlands and Wales.

Venner was in a class of his own in the Men's Singles, dropping only one game in his defence of the title he also won in 2001. That was in Round 1 when Daniel Cannon took the third game. After that small blemish Venner dispatched David Crowley, Neil Cartwright and Sam Cannon all three-straight before showing how to deal with the unusual long-pimpled style of Steve Hall in the final. The Sussex man beat the Welshman 11-4, 11-4, 11-8.

Second seed Hall had reached the final by winning his group and then dealing with the competition provided by Ian Packford, Geoff Grange, Ghana international Eric Hammond and fellow Welshman Neil Wright.

Sam Cannon, from Essex, a scratch entry on the day, was the surprise package of the tournament. He reached the semifinal, taking advantage of the vacant fourth seed position even though he came only second in his group. There he lost an 11-8 fifth game epic with Geoff Grange. Cannon then came through a preliminary round match before beating Mark Jackson, the Cippenham player who had outsted fourth seed Hari Gehlot in the groups. Cannon then collected the scalps of Roland McLellan and Graham Outrim before succombing to Venner in the semis. Outrim, himself, had a good day, beating Ian Packford in the group and then fifth seed Stephen Munson in the last sixteen.

The last remaining Cippenham member in the competition was Kimber Choda, who was runner-up in his group but then had a great win over seventh seed Ramesh Balla before losing to Wright in the quarters. Other Cippenham members who won their groups were Mark Banks, Mark Jackson, James Milton and tournament organizer Paul Baker.

Michele Cohen (Wiltshire) came from 2-1 down in her group match to beat Gail <<< results

Davey 11-7 in the fifth, but otherwise was hardly troubled, dropping only the first game to junior Sarah Hall on her way to the title. In the final she beat defending champion Rose Rainton 11-7, 11-5, 11-7. The semi-finalists were Sarah Horsnell, who ended the run of Cippenham's 13-years old Melanie Farquhar 11-9 in the fifth in the quarters, and Gail Davey, who added to her previous good form by defeating Anusha Seneviratne in the quarters.

Some of the closest matches took place in the consolation events, and three involved Cippenham's Marc Armstrong who won the Men's Consolation. His run of close matches started with an 11-9 fifth game success over Earl Sweeney. Then followed a relatively easy four-game victory over Dannel Pang before 11-8 in the fifth in the semi against Ramesh Gehlot and an epic 12-10 fifth game clincher in the final against Gavin West.

Organizer Paul Baker and referee Graham Trimming ensured that, even with the big entry, the tournament finished exactly on schedule.
