Double

Two Gold Medals for Gareth at Commonwealth Games

Gold



pippenham's table tennis hero Gareth Herbert had his finest hour yet as he brought home two gold medals from the Commonwealth Games in Manchester. After having been part of the England men's gold-winning team in the early part of the Games, Gareth sensationally won gold again when he and Andrew Baggaley, from Milton Keynes, won a thrillingly close Men's Doubles final.

For all his undoubted star quality Gareth confessed to having nerves. "It felt like I was holding a brick instead of a racket and my feet felt like they were sticking to the floor. It was pretty much the most nervous time of my life".

Gareth and Baggaley commenced their assault on the doubles title by eliminating the Australians Lavale and Brown 3-1 and then went through Casaba/Kassam (Canada) 3-2, Jackson/Li (New Zealand) 3-0 and then in the semi-final the talented Indians Baboor/Subramanian 3-2 at 11-8 in the fifth. The final produced an all-British match with Welshmen Ryan Jenkins and Adam Robertson, the former European Boys' Singles silver medallist. Gareth and Baggaley won the first game 11-9 and then were pegged back with a close 11-13 reverse in the second. A third game loss by 8-11 left them with a mountain to climb but the young English pair (Gareth is 21 and Baggalev only 19) fought back the win the fourth 11-9. Television viewers watched in awe as they then went 5-9 down in the fifth game before embarking on a marathon series of



deuce points in which both pairs held three championship points before Gareth and Baggaley converted their fourth for a 17-15 victory.

In the singles, Gareth played well to reach the quarter-final, the equal of any of the English players, but was disappointed to lose 1-4 to Chetan Baboor, the Indian player whom he had beaten in the team event. To reach that position Gareth had beaten Adam Robertson (Wales) 4-2 and the Scotland number one Euan Walker, to whom he had lost their last two encounters, 4-3. Cippenham members may remember Euan who practised a great deal at Cippenham before moving back to Scotland last year.

Previously, Gareth had played a major part in the success of the England team in bringing back the first gold medal. He recorded a win in the opening 3-2 win against Australia and then crucially beat the 2001 Commonwealth Championships silver medallist Chetan Baboor in the 3-1 semi-final victory over India. The final provided a fantastic 3-0 win over Nigeria in which Gareth had his best win for many months, defeating Segun Toriola 3-1. Toriola went on to win the Men's Singles event, beating Canada's world ranked number 10 Johnny Huang in the final. Also in the England team was Terry Young, from Maidenhead, who was also a member of the Cippenham club in his formative years and, like Gareth, owes much to the nationally-renowned coaching set-up at Cippenham, headed by Ken Phillier

Cippenham Table Tennis Centre also played a part in the preparation for other England players. British number one Matthew Syed and Terry Young finalised their preparation by training at Cippenham a few days before making the journey to

Saudi Visit Culminates In Another International Occasion at Cippenham

or ten days in August Cippenham Table Tennis Club played host to the first ever foreign team for persons with disabilities to take part in an international exchange visit in table tennis. The Saudi Arabian team for deaf players trained at Cippenham twice a day during their stay and were joined by members of the English deaf team and by members of the Cippenham club.

The visit culminated on Sunday with international matches between England and Saudi Arabia with the guest of honour the First Minister from the Saudi Arabian Embassy. England were far and away stronger than their Saudi counterparts and ran away 9-1 winners in the "A" team match and 6-4 in the "B" team match. Three of the Saudi "B" wins came from an Englishman guesting in the Saudi team that had brought only seven players.

The England "A" team romped into a 9-0 lead with two wins each from Bela Hegedus (who plays for Kingfisher in the Reading League). George Buck and Hitesh Kanji, one from Elaine Butterworth plus two doubles victories before the Saudis got their solitary score when Al-Hassan beat Butterworth in the last set.

For England "B", Alan Cunningham and Martin Strutt won all their singles, while Bell won once but Andrew Drury failed to score. England's victory was secured by a doubles win from Drury and Bell.
