First team flounder in short British League weekend but it's ...

MAXIMUM POINTS FOR SECOND AND THIRD TEAMS


There was a definite difference in the fortunes of the three Cippenham British League teams when the short third weekend was played in the middle of January. Whilst the second and third teams, previously bottom of Division 1 South and Midlands and Division 3 South respectively, took maximum points to elevate themselves into fifth position, the first team returned pointless and slipped in the alternate direction to the foot of Division 1 South.

The stars of the day were Danny Baxter and Eddie Mitchell who were both unbeaten in their four matches. In Division 1 South and Midlands, Cippenham II were the only team from the bottom four to register any points. Their two wins elevated them to fifth place although they will still have to play well in the last session next month to make certain of retaining their status for next season. Steve Munson also won his two matches in the 6-2 morning victory against Urban Progress II while Martin Gray and Owen Clutterbuck won one apiece, both losing to their opponents' star player Gergely Urban.

It was Owen that provided most of the back-up to Danny in the afternoon. His brace and a single from Martin dealt Fusion II a 5-3 defeat, a result that saw Cippenham leapfrog over their rivals in the league table.

The Cippenham third team, playing at Southall, responded well to their predicament in the league's most competitive division by winning both matches 5-3. Eddie, the star of the show with four wins, will not be available for the final weekend of the season so it was important that Cippenham bagged the points when the young star was present. The morning result 5-3 against Hastings was a triumph of team work. Each of the other players, Chris Hansell, Paul Baker and Tony Stead, contributed one win each. The result in the afternoon against Fusion III was the same, 5-3, but was created in a different manner. Chris provided the backbone to the team with two wins from the number one position and Tony added one to Eddie's second brace of the day.

The first team are in a very strong divi-

sion and will need to be on their best form next time to rise up from their perilous position. The good news is that Irish international David Hayes will be available to assist for the first time this season. He will need to be at his best to stop a run of disappointing results. In truth, the 7-1 morning defeat to runaway leaders Urban Progress I looked bad but in reality was a good performance that could have produced a better result. Only Rob Lemon managed to win but Cippenham lost five others close in the fifth and deciding end including Mark Butler's gallant effort against the unbeaten Tibor Kardar. However, that was followed by a disastrous 6-2 defeat to bottom team York Gardens with only Martin Adams emerging with credit after two very good wins.

Eddie halts the Welsh surge

The Cippenham Young Players' New Year Festival brought players from far and wide, including the usual successful contingent from Wales, to Slough at the weekend. Almost 300 entries were received for this 1-star open tournament, played on 17 tables over two days in two halls at the Club's Westgate School headquarters. Nearly 300 entries were received for this, the fourth running of the annual New Year tournament played in four age groups that follows the same successful format as the long running Summer Festival.

The locals also had a title to cheer as Cippenham's top boy, 14-years old Eddie Mitchell, seeded three, won the blue riband event, the Under-18 Boys' Singles. He did it the hard way, beating both the top two seeds en route.

After winning his group, a result that earned him a first round bye, Eddie beat Rafi Conn-Kowlessar 3-1 in round 2 and then the up and coming Mikael Papantoniou 3-0 in the quarter-final. His semi-final was far less straight-forward. Second seed Damilola Thomas took the first and third games to lead 2-1 before Eddie hit back to win the last two 11-9, 11-8. Waiting for him in the final was Welsh protégé Daniel O'Connell. The top seed had looked fairly comfortable until then, winning his quarter and

semi-final matches both 3-0, the latter an 11-7, 11-6, 11-8 win over Jarred Knowles, conqueror of fourth seed Daniel Moses in an all-Berkshire quarter-final. Eddie, though, had other ideas and turned the ranking upside down, winning the final 3-1.

Three of the other seven titles disappeared down to M4 towards Wales. There is nothing unusual in this as the Welsh juniors always do well at Cippenham. One of those titles went to O'Connell in the Under-16 Boys' Singles while Chloe Thomas won both the U18 and U16 Girls' Singles.

O'Connell was, as he was again later in the U18 event, top seed in the U16 event and was barely troubled as he swept his way to the title. Lewis Williams did manage one game in the final as did Ashley Facey-Thompson in the second round. Eddie was seeded second for this event but found Williams just too good in their semi-final. This heralded a good run for the unseeded Williams who had already been seen off challenges from Lawrence Sweeney and Danny Spaul, the conqueror of fourth seed Thomas Dantzig. The other semi-final saw O'Connell win 3-0 in comfortable fashion against third seed Daniel Moses.

It all turned out well for Chloe Thomas in the end as the top seed won both the U18 and U16 titles. However, she was made to work hard for it, no more so than in the U18 semi-final when she came from two games down to beat Sushmita Limbu 9-11, 10-12, 11-9, 11-7, 11-8. A round earlier she had also been taken to a deciding fifth game by Chantal Wilson. By contrast, the 3-0 win over Sally Hoang in the final was easy. Thomas and Limbu had met each other earlier in the final of the U16s. This time Limbu only managed to win the first game before Thomas got going to win 3-1. Hoang's was probably the best performance as she reached the final of the U18s from an unseeded position as well as the semi-final of the U16s.

Four counties shared the U14 and U12 titles on the Saturday. The boys' titles were won by Ashley Facey-

Thompson of Middlesex and Jack Bennett of Sussex, while Surrey's Lucy Lou and Berkshire's Maria Tsaptinos won the girls' events. The latter was the star of the day as she featured in two finals.

Cippenham's other successful player was George Weller who was runner-up in the U12 Boys' Consolation.

The event was organized and refereed by Ken Phillips with invaluable assistance from Jan Chapman, Steve Smith and an army of helpers.
