# Melanie and James Supreme at 1-

Star Open

here were several fine perform ances by home players at the Cippenham Under-14/16 1-Star Open Championships on 12th January. The star of the show was 13-years old Melanie Farquhar who lives in Reading but has trained at Cippenham for the past two years. Melanie was dominant throughout the day and finished as girls' champion in both age categories. In the final of the U16 she fought off a spirited challenge from another Cippenham youngster Sylvana Bielec in a match full of fast attacking table tennis. Melanie was often driven back many feet from the table but still counter-attacked with force enough to soak up Sylvana's blistering attack. In the final of the U14 event Melanie beat one of the Welsh visitors, Emmaleigh Newman, who she also later beat in the semi-final of the older age category.

James Milton had his best tournament yet. The Hedgerley boy fought back to survive four match points to beat Cippenham colleague Mark Armstrong at deuce in the fifth of their classic semi-final encounter. Both boys played their fast upto-the-table topspin attack in an entertaining match that swayed first one way then the other. Meanwhile in the other semifinal Cippenham player Ashley Shaw was giving the highly ranked top seed Vytas Rybakas the fright of his life. The Lithuanian, currently based in Essex, only managed to win this epic at deuce in the fifth. Worse was to follow for Rybakas who, apart from claiming the third game, was outplayed by James in the final.

Rybakas duly won the U14 event earlier in the day. He needed four games to see off the challenge of William Maybanks in the final while Maybanks had ended the run of Ashley Shaw one round earlier. Showing that he was not to be outdone by the more well known home players, Ashley reached the semi-finals of both events and will be a force to be reckoned with in the future. The other semi-finalist in the U14 Boys' Singles was Joseph Chacoliades.

Another Cippenham player who caught the eye was 10 years-old Katie Rule. In her best tournament to date Katie reached the quarter-finals of both events, beating Cippenham colleague Catherine Hayes in the U16s. Catherine also reached the quarters of the U14 while Jenny Hansell did likewise in the U16s.

A huge entry of 160 kept Referee and Organizer Ken Phillips, together with sixteen tables, busy and the event was superbly managed on the day by Robert Hansell.

#### **David Wins Munster Open**

Cippenham's David Hayes made the trip across to Ireland in the middle of January to play in the Munster Junior Open and showed that he is better than any of the home players at his age group. With all the top Irish players competing David won the Cadet Boys' Singles and reached the semi-final of the Junior Boys' Singles.

#### Slough Through in Alec Brook

The Slough veteran men's trio of Mike Rhodes, Paul Baker and John Barclay progressed in the second stage of the Alec Brook Trophy at Watford on 25<sup>th</sup> January. Each player won once to add to two concessions as a two-man North Middlesex were beaten 5-3 and then Mike got his three to spearhead his team to a 5-3 win over Watford. Paul and John won one each in this match. In the final match North Herts were too strong, winning 5-1, with only Mike winning for Slough.

#### Jo's Vital Win Against Austria

Joanna Parker beat Martina Petzner 11-9 in the fifth to help secure England a 3-2 win over Austria in the European Women's League Division 1 in Linz, Austria. Jo was also in the England team beaten 3-0 by Bulgaria the same weekend.

#### Gareth Through Group in Croatia

Gareth Herbert beat Li Jiang (FIJ) and Mads Sorensen (DEN) to top his group at the Croatian Open despite losing to Vasile Florea (ROM) deuce in the seventh. However, Gareth went out in the next round to the famous Russian Dmitrij Mazunov.

# **Ladies Finish Fourth**

The Cippenham team had an indifferent final weekend in the Women's British League but still came away from Grantham in their highest ever finishing position of fourth. Placed third after the first weekend in September, Cippenham drew 3-3 with London Progress but lost 2-4 to runners-up Horsham to consolidate that position at the end of the first stage. The top four teams then played each other again to determine the final positions. In this second stage Cippenham lost all three matches, 2-4 again to Horsham, 1-5 to the champions Grove I and crucially 2-4 to Grove II.

The best performance of the weekend came in the opening match in which two wins for Gemma Chapman and one from Rebecca Hurrell gave the team the point they needed to ensure playing in the top half in stage 2.

Gemma played well all weekend, winning six of her ten matches whereas former Welsh international Lesley Keast and Rebecca won only two each.



# A Win and a Loss for Both Teams

Doth Cippenham teams experienced a victory and a defeat in the British League at their home club on 19th January. The "A" team started with an exciting 5-3 victory over London Progress II but then failed in the afternoon by the same score to Ellenborough. The "B" team did it in reverse fashion, losing 6-2 in the morning to divisional leaders PSP Westinsure 6-2 and then beat Hastings also 6-2 in the afternoon.

Martin Adams was man of the match against Progress in Division 1 South. After Richard Tilford had got Cippenham off to a great start with a four game victory over James Sprackling, Martin put Cippenham further ahead by eclipsing Daniel Fesahatsion in three games. London Progress, the divisional winners last season, were not going to lie down and just take it and they fought back with three wins – by Vidal Graham over Mark Butler, Darek Zurowski over Lee Dredge and Fesahatsion against Richard. The Cippenham players applied all their fighting spirit and won the next three sets to clinch the match. Mark beat Sprackling 15-13 in the fourth, then Martin completed his double against Zurowski and Lee gave Cippenham victory with another four-game win over Graham.

The afternoon match against Ellenborough (Enfield) was a reverse of the score between the two teams in the first half of the season. This time, Cippenham went 0-4 down as each of the home players just failed to take advantage of winning situations. A spirited recovery saw Richard beat Gary Tendler 14-12 in their deciding fifth game and then Martin beat Simon Philipsz to give Cippenham a chance. However, with Mark losing to Jimmy Walsh it mattered not that Lee got the better of Matthew Spero in the final set.



Cippenham "B" team's 2-6 defeat against leaders PSP Westinsure was remarkable only for a win by Mark Jackson against the highly-ranked Eddie Roofe. The only other success against the Wiltshire-based team was Robert Lemon's over Dave Richards in the final set.

Better was to follow in the afternoon match when bottom team Hastings were beaten 6-2 in a match that was much closer and more exciting than the final score suggests. Robert Hansell led the way with a first set 12-10 in the fifth win against Richard Tanner. Team-mates Mark Jackson and Robert Lemon then followed suit against Graham Carter and Sally Weston respectively to put Cippenham 3-0 up. However, the south coast side hit back with two wins, by Matthew Gander over Paul Baker and by Tanner over Mark. Robert Hansell then completed the double that earned him the man of the match nomination by overcoming Weston after having lost the first game. With the score at 4-2 Paul faced Carter and Robert Lemon faced Gander on adjoining tables. Hastings needed to win both matches to force a draw while
