It's A Tough Time For The Ladies at Andover

It was going tough in the first session of fixtures in the Women's British League at Andover over the weekend 12/13th September. Having won Division 3 and Division 2 in successive seasons, the first team were making their debut in Division 1. Unfortunately, the first half fixtures had to be completed without new signing Shelley Ruoco who was unavailable, and it was the old guard of Sue Collier, Kai Milvek and Claire Plumridge that took to the table.

None of the players played to their full potential and the record of three points from a possible ten will have to be improved upon at the second weekend in January if the team is not to be immediately relegated back to Division 2. Sue played well until the last match, in which she lost both her singles, to record seven wins from ten matches. In fact, she was made Player of the Weekend, due to some extent to the use of her medical skills in treating a player with an injured hand. Kai, the Estonian World Veterans Team Champion, struggled to win only four and Claire could only manage two wins.

The solitary victory came 5-1 against fellow promotees Yashima South Kesteven Sovereigns II of Grantham. In addition, the points were shared in a 3-3 draw with Eastbourne club Shinewater British Queen but matches against Leeds Ladies (1-5), Irish Ladies (2-4) and Grove I (2-4) were lost.

A second team was also entered at short notice to fill a gap in Division 2. This team are also fifth in their division at the half way stage and this was a creditable performance from a young and inexperienced team that should realistically have been

in Division 3. Twelve-year old Gemma Chapman played at number one and led the team well with four wins from her ten matches including some notable scalps that will catapult her up the national rankings, but the most successful player with five wins was Sue Hayes. Jane Dickens was disappointing, only obtaining one win, and Emma Human made one appearance without success.

The team's two points both came on the second day in drawn matches with Ellenborough and Yashima South Kesteven Sovereigns III. The team also suffered a 4-2 defeat at the hands of Global Sports and 1-5 to both Ulster Ladies and Norton Ladies.




