Thomas Mitchell reigns supreme at the Slough Closed Championships junior events

Four Tides For Thomas



Thomas Mitchell capped a wonder ful season by claiming four titles when the junior events of the Slough Closed Championships were decided at Cippenham Table Tennis Centre on 18th April. A recent good run of form has seen Thomas rise to number three in the England Under-12 ranking list, and he has, at last, recently been added to the England U12 Training Squad in recognition of this.

True, the star players Martin Rule and Nick Wilson were absent, but Thomas decimated the field to take the Junior Boys' Singles, Cadet Singles, Under-12 Singles and Woolwich Junior League Singles. The best match of the day was, without doubt, the Cadet Singles final in which Thomas and Gemma Chapman slugged out a hard hitting match decided only at 19 in the third after Thomas had retrieved a one game deficit.

Spare a thought for David Hayes, a year and a half the junior of Thomas, who succombed to his older teammate four times during the day. Only in the semifinal of the Junior Boys' Singles did David manage to sneak a game. The WJL Singles match went to deuce in one game but much of the rest of the time it was all too easy for Thomas. The best performance from Thomas on the day was the demolition job on established Division One player Ben Beveridge, who was summarily dismissed 13 and 12 in the Boys' final.

The irrepressible Gemma Chapman also managed two titles. The Junior Girls' Singles resulted in an expected win for the 13 year old over Emma Human, then Gemma and Emma captured the Junior Doubles crown with a final victory over Thomas Mitchell, his only defeat of the day, and Ross Drabble.

The Woolwich Junior League Handicap Singles resulted in a final between Francesca Parnell and Emily Tucker and was won by the former.

Other awards were presented on the day. Unsurprisingly Thomas Mitchell was given the Leo Thompson Memorial Trophy for the most improved junior player with an allegience to Slough. The second award was being presented for the first time. The Bob Barlow Cup was awarded to a player at the Championships on the decision of Ken Phillips, taking into account attitude, sportsmanship, presentation etc. The popular winner was Francesca Parnell.

Bradley and Joanna on the GLORY TRAIL IN IOM

Bradley Evans, aged 9, and Joanna Parker, 11, represented England Under-11s in the British Primary Schools International Championships, held on the Isle of Man, in a three day event last month.

The participating teams were England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales and the Isle of Man, each team comprising four players, England finishing first in the team event in both the girls' and boys' team events. Bradley, beng the youngest at 9 years of age, played alongside fellow team members - Tim Yarnell, Adam Bleakley and Richard Wesley, all aged 11. Joanna played alongside Abigail Embling, Kelly Sibley and Bethany Rees. On the final day, all the players competed in the individual under-11's competition.

Bradley, unseeded, played some great table tennis, getting better as the day went on. He beat the Irish, Welsh, Scottish and IOM number ones on his way to the final. One of the most exciting games being against the Irish no. 1, Brian McDonnell having won one game each, the third and final game seemed to be escaping from Bradley. However, having been 16-20 down, Bradley saved four match points, scoring six points in a row to take the final game 22-20.

In the final Bradley played our English number one, Tim Yarnell, also ranked number 1 in the U12 age group. Tim won the first game quite easily, Bradley took the second, but the third went to the older and more experienced player 21-18. Joanna, seeded 2, reached the final without losing a game and then beat the top seed, Abigail Embling, 2-0 to convincingly take the title for the second year running.

Four Out Of Four for Michael

Michael Auchterlonie, from Twyford, maintained his extraordinary unbeaten record on 10th April at the Cippenham 2 Star Open Championships. Auchterlonie has now won all four senior open tournaments that Cippenham has held and on this occcasion nobody got close to inflicting defeat on the man who has made the event his own. Auchterlonie commenced the event seeded two but was assisted by the absence of the top seed Abdul Wuraola who was required to travel north with his club for a British League match on the following day.

On his way to the final Auchterlonie came top of his five man initial group and then beat Richard Cosens before ending the challenge of Surrey's Chris Beckley in the semi-final 21-17, 21-17. After that the final itself was an easier affair with Surrey's Steve Giles being demolished 21-8, 21-11. In his semi-final Giles had seen off the challenge of Reading's Hari Gehlot in a closely fought match and had ended the run of the last surviving Cippenham club member, Kimber Choda, one round earlier.

The women's event received a poor entry and was won by Sarah Horsnell of Middlesex with the home club's Gemma Chapman being run-

The Consolation Singles provided more success for Cippenham as both finalists are members of the host club. The greater experience of Berkshire veteran Syd Montgomery eventually was too much for the highly ranked cadet John Camilleri.
