ippenham Table Tennis Club are again champions of the Slough League. For an unprecedented thirteenth consecutive season and the twenty-second in total, the


Club has carried away the major local honour. Throughout its history, Cippenham has put together many different teams of players that have won the title and the Outlaws team this season was no exception. Led by Club Captain Paul Baker with regulars Graham Trimming, Ashley Shaw and Sue Hayes and not inconsiderable assistance from Irish junior inter-

national David Hayes when required, Outlaws were just too good for their opponents.

However, the race for the title was tighter than usual and at one time it looked as if the title might even be wrested away from Cippenham's grasp by a Chalfont St. Peter Community Centre club that tried all within their power in the final few weeks of the season to win their first title. That included playing a strong second team in matches against Outlaws but the Cippenham team were alert to this possibility and fielded teams strong enough to defeat Chalfont Bohemians 9-1 on both occasions.

It was the matches between the two title contenders that really decided matters, however, When Chalfont Argonauts travelled to Cippenham in December they were soundly beaten by

Outlaws 7-3. The recent return match at Chalfont was more closely fought. At one time the score stood 4-3 in Chalfont's favour with their best player, Danny Baxter, appearing in his only match all season, still to play. However, David Hayes was determined that the should title not snatched from the club he has done so much for re-



Outlaws did lose one match during the season-to Burnham Nomads 7-3 on an evening when things did not go right for the home team. Graham Trimming suffered two of his five seasonal defeats in this match although the Outlaws team was not first choice-

indeed, Paul Baker rather unkindly described it as his "Carling Cup team"!

The Slough League season now enters its second phase. Division One teams are playing in a seven-week two-a-side competition while Division Two has been engaged in a ten-match handicap league since immediately after Christmas.

Even though the Maidenhead Closed Championships have been staged at Cippenham for several years now, this season is the first in a few that the Club has had a presence in the Maidenhead League.

Our representatives did well with Denise Rolfe becoming Veteran Women's Singles champion and was also runner-up in the Division 1 Singles. Eddie Mitchell was part of the duo that won the Handicap Doubles and also partnered Ken Phillips to the final of the Men's Doubles—Ken rolling back the years! Another title came the Club's way when Jan Chapman partnered her daughter Gemma to victory in the Women's Doubles.

Gemma does not play for Cippenham in the Maidenhead League but, nevertheless is a member of the Club. She was also successful in the Women's Singles, Mixed Doubles and Tweenies' Singles.

Vets Face Relegation

ippenham Table Tennis Club's veterans team travelled to the Doncaster Dome over the weekend of the 11th and 12th February for the second and final round of matches in the ETTA Veterans' British League. The team, playing in Division One, started in third place out of six but with only two points covering second to fifth it promised to be a tight and tense weekend and so it proved.

Diccon Gray, the recently crowned national Veterans' Doubles champion, again led the team with distinction winning nine out of ten playing at number one to end with 17 out of 20 and top of the divisional averages. Paul Baker, playing at number three, picked up four wins to end with seven from twenty, while Mike Rhodes had a particularly hard weekend without a win to finish on three from twenty.

Cippenham started on Saturday morning against Bribar Nomads, the only team to beat them in the first round of matches. This was a much closer affair with Diccon beating Chris Knight and then Phil Cox to put Cippenham in with the chance of at least a point. Paul had chances taking both his matches to a deciding fifth end but the eventual outcome was a 4-2 defeat.

Next up were Thornton Sports, Diccon beat Karl Bushell and Paul beat Chris Blake to put Cippenham 2-1 ahead. However Diccon then lost his only match of the weekend to Dave Robson and Mike lost out to Blake to set up a tense finish, with Paul beating Bushell to secure a point.

The final match on Saturday was against leaders Fullerians. Diccon again led from the front with wins over Hari Gehlot and Colin Carslake but try as they might Mike and Paul couldn't find that vital third win.

Going into Sunday's matches four teams could still join Tameside in relegation with the Cippenham team knowing that two wins might not be enough to stay up. The first match against the bottom team was a topsyturvy affair with Diccon winning twice and Paul once to win a point with Mike agonisingly losing two five-game battles.

Cippenham needed a miracle in their last match against South Essex to stay

Davis and Donovan Again Supreme at Vets Open

Steve Davis must enjoy playing at Cippenham, especially in veterans' events. The Surrey player, champion at the 2005 summer event, made it two in a row when he won the Men's Singles title at the Cippenham Veterans' 2-Star Open Championships the first Sunday in February. In the final, Davis was superb, his ferocious twowinged attack in full display. He carried far too much fire power for the surprise finalist Steve Preston.

Veterans' events at Cippenham invariably provide a few surprises along with lots of competitive table tennis. This tournament was no exception. The first shock came in the preliminary round groups when third seed Derek Holman was beaten by Tony Brown 3-0. Holman, second in the group, still qualified for the main event but was then eliminated by evergreen Maurice Isaacs in the second knock-out round.

The other seeds managed to hold on to their positions in their groups, although top seed Chris Pickard had to come back from 2-1 to beat Andy Misseldine and fourth seed Davis also needed five games to see off Eddie Herrity.

Eventual finalist Steve Preston had a mixed set of results in his group. He

beat the higher ranked Tom Carr but then lost to both Clive Banham and Earl Jeffers to finish third out of six in the group.

Davis beat Preston 3-0 in the final; all the close matches happened in the earlier rounds including Davis taking five games to dismiss Misseldine in round two. Top seed Chris Pickard took five games to get past Tom Carr in the quarter-final but then fell to the more awkward style of Preston 3-1 in the semi. This shorter match was a relief for the tiring Preston as he had needed five games in both his previous two rounds against Paul Martindill and Graham Outrim.

Davis' semi-final victim was Andy Warner, conqueror of his Suffolk colleague Fred Dove one round earlier. Dove had also required five games in his round two match against Ian Buchanan

The final of the consolation was an all-Bucks affair won by Mike Wilkins over Cippenham member Paul Elliott.

The Women's Singles was run as a round robin and was won by Regina Donovan, who had made the trip down from Wales to regain the title she won in 2004, over Sue Adamson.
