Five straight wins for Cippenham as Jemma remains unbeaten

Girls storm to JBL Div 3 title

It was incredible! Starting the weekend in fourth place in Division 3 of the Junior British League, the Cippenham girls' team put in a flawless performance that propelled themselves to the title, winning all their matches along the way.

The season that had started so poorly back in October, with a 6-0 drubbing at the hands of BATTS B in their very first match, ended in exhilarating fashion with a 6-0 demolition of Pudsey. With that, and nearest rivals Urban failing against Cardiff on an adjacent table, came the title and the glory of being Division 3 champions in their first season back in the big league after having won the right to participate only through the play-offs back in July.

Although it was a huge all-round team performance, the star of the show was Jemma Walker who won all ten of her matches during the weekend. Jemma demonstrated the great progress she has made this season after having won only half of her matches back in October. Backing her up, Shristi Ghosh won eight from the number one position, and the newly crowned Bucks Women's Singles champion, Megan Ashfield, won five.

The inspiration for the weekend's performance came early on when Cippenham avenged their first half 6-0 defeat against BATTS B. Jessica Jarvis put the Harlow-based team ahead but the Cippenham spirit rose with Shristi Ghosh. Down in games 2-0, she turned the match and maybe the weekend around against Sarah Menghistab, winning the final three legs 11-9, 14-12, 12 -10. Jemma Walker then began her dominance when beating Gracie Edwards 3-1 and Shristi extended Cippenham's lead with another five games against Jarvis. Once Megan had lost to Edwards it was left to Jemma to secure both points for Cippenham as she came from behind to defeat Menghistab 3-1.

Megan was again the only loser on



Saturday afternoon, down in five against Lydia John but by the time she returned to the table, Cippenham were 4-1 up against Cardiff with Shristi and Jemma having both bagged braces even though they both went the distance with one of their opponents. Megan then got her score up and running as Cippenham ran out 5-1 winners.

Saturday evening brought the pivotal match against top placed Urban. Shristi and Megan both found the Londoner's number one Mollie Patterson too hot to handle but everything else went Cippenham's way including Jemma's last ditch win over Ema Gadzhova. However, even that 4-2 victory over the team that had become Cippenham's closest rivals for the title did not propel

Cippenham above Urban and they left the hall on Saturday evening in second place but with a day's work well done.

It was all to play for when Sunday arrived. Cippenham were still one point behind Urban, despite having beaten their rivals the previous evening. It did not start well, either, with Shristi losing a tight 14-12 fifth end battle with Charlotte Weatherby and this was followed by Megan's defeat at the hands of Hannah Clark. Cippenham were 2-0 down to Northfield and needed a response from star player Jemma Walker. That's exactly what they got with a clinical performance against Iman Muktar and this inspired Shristi to win a tight encounter with Clark. Jemma returned to beat Weatherby 3-1 and Megan

claimed the second point and register a 4-2 win. Meanwhile Urban were playing out a 3-3 draw with BATTS but were still above Cippenham in the table but now only on sets aggregate.

The equation was fairly straight-forward. Cippenham had to beat Pudsey and Urban had to drop a point against Cardiff, a team they had beaten in October. The Cippenham girls rose to the challenge and saw off the bottom team 6-0 but even that was not without its scrapes. Megan and Shristi were both taken the distance by Alice Rice while Jemma was supreme, winning both her matches 3-0. On an adjacent table Urban, who had held the lead in the division right from the start, choked. Not only did they drop the necessary



point to ensure Cippenham leapfrogged above them into the title slot but they contrived to lose to the Welsh team 4-2 and make the final table more comfortable reading for team coach Ken Phillips and his gallant players.

Matuzevicius emerges the strongest from maximum entry

nother maximum entry assembled at Cippenham Table Tennis Centre on Saturday for the Cippenham Super 6 Senior 2-Star Open Championship. The 48 players were arranged in eight groups of six for the preliminary stage and then separated into two knock-out events including a consolation for those finishing in the lower half of their group.

The event started out as anyone's title because with so few points separating the top players any one of a dozen or so could have seen the opportunity to grasp a title. Top seed was Rajan Waterman, now living in Bristol, but a Cippenham member a few years ago. Berkshire interest surrounded the up and coming Daniel McTiernan, from Reading, while Tom Windram, the most successful player in Cippenham's first team in the Senior British League this season, was seeded seven.

All the seeded players managed to progress into the main competition from their groups but a few suffered losses along the way. Fourth seed Michael Bree was beaten by Jonny Higgins and sixth seed Martin Gunn lost narrowly to Ben Larcombe. Both went through in second place. Fifth seed Mohammed Owadally did finally win his group but only after a count-back following his defeat by Vincent Wu 15-13 in the fifth game. However, Wu lost to Michael Julian and that led to a three-way tie on

matches won.

Rajan Waterman may have dominated his group, but that was as far as the top seed was allowed to go, beaten by Jody Bevington 12-10 in the fifth of their match in the last sixteen. Bevington then came up against Michael Bree, who he had partnered to the runners-up position in the recent Cippenham Team Open. On this occasion it was Bree that emerged the winner and he then defeated Daniel McTiernan in the semifinal. Ben Larcombe made up the quarter of quarter-finalists in the top half of the draw

In the bottom half, Jonny Higgins continued his progress at the expense of Paralympic star Dave Wetherill and made the semi-final when he put paid to the run of Neil Wright. Tom Windram also made the quarter-final by beating Patrick Green but was unable to extend his run against Martin Matuzevicius. The man from Hampshire was now flying and beat Higgins 3-0 in the semi-final to set up a final against Michael Bree.

The final was also three-straight with Matuzevicius gaining his first ever Cippenham title against Bree 11-8, 11-9, 11-8

Best performance by a Cippenham Table Tennis Club member came from Hari Vennapusa who had a good win

over Danny Lucking and made it through to the main event where he took the first game but eventually succumbed to Michael Julian

Cippenham women sweep up county titles

Cippenham's female players dominated the Buckinghamshire Closed Championships when the county held its annual event at their home venue on 1st February. And to the delight of Cippenham Head Coach Ken Phillips, it was the latest crop of young players that scooped most of the honours. Altogether, Cippenham players won three of the five major events on offer.

Pride of place went to Megan Ashfield whose improvement over the past year has been immense. Megan did the double of Women's Singles and Women's Doubles, the latter in combination with Shristi Ghosh.

The Women's Singles was a keenly fought event in which no player survived unbeaten. Megan emerged top of the pile by virtue or her win over Sue Hayes who was adjudged runner-up. However, Megan's conqueror, Jemma Walker, lost to both Sue and Shristi Ghosh as the Cippenham players fought out their own battle to decide the top four places.



Megan's second title was in tandem with Shristi when they beat Jemma Walker and Carys Evans in the final of the Women's Doubles, a match featuring all four of Cippenham's successful young quartet.

Jemma then teamed up with another Cippenham protégé Ben Naylor-Smith and reached the final of the Mixed Doubles where they lost to mother and son combination of Susana and Robert Hansell. Robert, who is one of Cippenham's star players in the Senior British League, completed the family affair when partnering his father Nick to the final of the Men's Doubles where they lost to Ian Mush and Steve Munson. Earlier Ben Naylor-Smith and Shae

Thakker, another of the emerging stars at Cippenham, upset the form guide with a superb victory over Alan Cherry and Craig Brown in the quarter-final of the doubles.
