Champions of Maidenhead for first time in 23 years

Saxons beat Spartans to Maidenhead title

ippenham TTC has won the Maidenhead League for the first time in 23 years. The last time the trophy rested at Cippenham was after season 1988-9 and one of the players involved that year was also involved in the latest triumph. Club founder Graham Trimming has now been involved in five of the Club's seven successful title challenges but this is the first time he has played in every match while doing so.

From the early stages of the season it became apparent that the Club was likely to get hold of the trophy once more, after the disappointment of last season when we missed out by one point. That was because the two Cippenham teams, Saxons and Spartans, quickly pulled away from the rest of the field and it became a matter not of whether but which of the two would secure the title. When Spartans beat Saxons 6-4 back in November it seemed that might still not be enough for Spartans to pull back the deficit that had by then opened up. But with their seemingly greater firepower the threat from Spartans could not be dismissed. Shortly afterwards Saxons fell to two miserable defeats either side of Christmas and the pendulum swung back firmly in Spartans' favour.

However, it all swung back around again in March. Saxons faced the first match in March with a depleted side against Old Gords Harriers. Sue Hayes stepped up a division and what a wonderful job she did, winning her three and contributing fully to an easy doubles win in a fantastic 9-1 result.

That buoyed Saxons and they went into the crunch match with title rivals

Spartans with renewed fervour but even they would not have dreamed the result. Saxons faced a Spartans team at full strength featuring three players with better records than any of themselves.

Simon Wilde set the tone for the night with an opening 11-9 in the fifth against Eddie Mitchell. When Steve Smith had beaten Ricky Hardcastle 11-6 in the fifth, after saving match points in the fourth, and Graham Trimming had overcome Tom Mitchell 11-8 in the fifth Saxons were in dreamland. Steve then beat Eddie 3-1 to make the score 4-0 before Tom pulled one back for Spartans 3-0 against Simon.

Graham won the first two games easily against Ricky before the latter hit back in the third. However, that was all he managed as Graham secured the

fourth 13-11 to put Saxons 5-1 ahead. Tom restored the scoreline a little against Steve but after that it was all Saxons. Graham secured a unique treble winning a close encounter with Eddie 11-8 then Simon edged out Ricky 11-8 in the fifth. A dispirited Spartans, who had lost all five sets that went to a deciding game, did not even stay to play the doubles and Saxons had finished up the right side on an unlikely 8-2 scoreline.

Saxons were left needing eight points from their final match against Castle Hill Pumas and with Steve winning three and Simon and Graham two each that's exactly what they got.

In the past week or so Cippenham Trojans have been confirmed Division 2 champions thus securing a rare double for the Club (see page 2).







Back to back titles for Williams

yan Williams, from Essex, obviously likes playing at Cippenham. A month ago he won the main title at the Cippenham Cadet Open and on Saturday he followed this up by winning the Cippenham Super 6 Junior 2-Star Open.

Williams, the fourth seed, won his preliminary round group dropping only two games and one of these was to Shane Clarke who trains at Cippenham. Shane went on to finish second in that group to qualify for the competition proper in which he beat Ethan Ball before falling at the quarter-final stage to the eventual runner-up Isaac Beevor.

As well as Williams, both the other top seeds made it through the preliminary round by winning their groups. Top seed Leon Thomson dropped only one game in qualifying while third seed Isaac Beevor was taken to a fourth game twice. Martin Matuzevicius, in group 2 that was without a seeded player, surprisingly lost 12-10 in the deciding game to Karan Cheeta who won only one other match and finished fifth. Marcus Henshaw also lost just once in this group but his loss to Matuzevicius resulted in him being relegated to second place.

Leon Thomson, after having received a bye in the first knock-out round, went out in the quarter-final. His conqueror was Jimmy Yeung who had earlier finished second in group 3 and now overcame the top seed 11-9 in the fifth game. Yeung was no match for Williams, however, in the semi-final as the eventual winner, who had beaten Cippenham's Harrison Simmons in the quarters, coasted through 3-0 to set up the final with Beevor.

In the bottom half of the draw Beevor and Matuzevicius met in the semi-final with the former winning comfortably three-straight. Williams took the first two games of the final but Beevor hit back in the third. That was as far as his challenge went, however, as Williams ran out 11-5 in the fourth game to claim his second title in as many months.

After finishing fourth in his group, Cippenham's Alex Parkinson had a couple of good wins to take him to the final of the consolation event but there he met his match in Ben Foster, losing 3-1, 15-13 in the fourth.

This became especially true for the cadet team when Sam Fletcher pulled out of the side leaving it with only two boys.

All in all, many of the players should be quite satisfied with their performances and many of them are young, playing in a competition against players much older. This is especially true of the girls' team of whom coach Ken Phillips has high hopes for the future.
