SUE IS ETTA COACH OF THE YEAR


Sue Hayes maintained the Club's tradition at the ETTA National **Teaching and Training Conference** Awards dinner on 8th September by gaining the ETTA Female Coach of the Year 2001 award.

This follows Ken Phillips' success in the male event in 1999 and 2000 and further enhances the Club's standing as one of the leading centres of excellence coaching in the country. Since moving to Slough four years ago, Sue has been an integral part of the coaching set-up at the Club and, as one of the group of coaches which travel with the junior teams and players to tournaments most weekends, has been a huge contributor to the success that the Club and Slough, Maidenhead and High Wycombe teams have achieved in recent

Sue also plans many of the training sessions held at Cippenham and for the past two seasons has also held high office as the Coaching Chairman for the Southern Region. In the latter job she is responsible for the training of the regional squad that meets at Cippenham at regular intervals. Under her guidance the Southern Region won the inaugural Inter-Regional Squad Championships earlier this year.

Cippenham Table Tennis Club itself also picked up an award in the newly created ETTA PremierClub of the Year awards with runners-up nationally in the top Excellence level. This again demonstrates the high esteem that the Club is held in nationally. Club Secretary Graham Trimming collected the award along with Sue and Graham said he was "delighted at the progress being made by the Club and valued the award which was due to a lot of hard work by a large number of very dedicated individuals who give much of their life to the Club".
