## Another Honour for Graham

Cippenham TTC Chairman and General Secretary Graham Trimming picked up another honour at the end of June. As a reward for his dedicated service over 35 years to the Club that he founded in 1973 and to the Slough League, Graham was elected as one of only two new Vice-Presidents of the English Table Tennis Association. The impressive badge was presented to Graham by Alex Murdoch, Chairman of the ETTA, at the national governing body's Annual General Meeting.

"It was a honour I never even dreamed about" said a happy and proud Graham. Such honours are normally given to servants of the national body, it is much rarer for a Vice-Presidency to be gained for work in affiliated clubs.

This caps a great year in which five Club members have been honoured by the ETTA. Graham (*PremierClub* Volunteer of the Year), Jacquie Lovell (Volunteer Coordinator of the Year), Jan Chapman (Female Coach of the Year) and Stephanie Mitchell (Young Volunteer of the Year) were all recipients of awards at the National Club and Volunteer Awards in September. Then a month later, Jan and Sue Hayes were presented with the ETTA Merit Award.

## Women win WBL Division 3

Rachel Farquhar put in another stunning performance as Cippenham won the Bribar Women's British League Third Division title. The 15-year old Rachel lost just once over the whole of the second weekend of matches at Doncaster to add to her unblemished display in the first weekend earlier in the season. Her just reward was the prize for Player of the Weekend.

Rachel's performance was backed up by good displays from team-mates Sue Hayes and Caroline Linz as Cippenham leapfrogged over rivals Southampton West to gain the divisional crown by one point. In the key match Cippenham improved upon their 3-3 draw with the south coast side in the first half of the season to win the showdown 4-2. Both defeats were at the hands of Southampton's number one Mihilda Sillard from

France. Rachel and Caroline both beat Sarah Warwick while Rachel, again, and Sue did likewise against Becky House.

The only match that Cippenham did not win over the weekend was the 3-3 draw with Staffordshire Ladies. It was in this match that Rachel suffered her only defeat of the season to Suus Tanke. Cippenham had also needed to play the same Staffordshire side in the opening matches before the division was split into two halves. That time Tanke was not present and Cippenham prevailed 4-2.

Both other matches were won: 6-0 against Guernsey B and 4-2 against St. Andrews 2.

## Training, Training and more ... Training at Cippenham

What is it that is going to maintain Cippenham TTC's eminent position in the national table tennis and local sporting circles for years to come? One very important aspect is to be able to call upon a capable, dedicated and above all, well trained, volunteer workforce.

Training of volunteers has been one of the two major planks of the Club's development plan over the past year or so. Already, the Club has hosted a Tournament Organizers' course last July, both days of a Level 1 coaching course either side of Christmas along with its associated child protection and emergency life support courses. Another seven Club members are booked on another, external, emergency life support class on July 2. Of course we all hope never to have to use the skills learned in the latter but it is reassuring for Club members to know that there is likely to be someone properly trained if they ever need such assistance.

In the past month the Club has held another two courses. The first, at the end of May, was an "ability" course in which delegates were trained in special coaching techniques for players with disabilities. Seven Club members attended.

The focus shifted to umpires at the end of June. Mick Strode and David Edwards were the tutors and assessors while seventeen delegates attended including eight Club members. The feedback received from the delegates was fantastic and Jacquie Lovell is to be congratulated on making the day so enjoyable. The budding umpires will be further assessed at the first Cippenham Series open event in August and hopefully all will earn their badge. A mass of "brownie points" have been won with the ETTA with this initiative but it will not stop there. For some delegates this was just the start—the aim is to upgrade their umpiring qualifications to those of a Tournament Referee later in the year.

Congratulations also to William Tint and Eddie Mitchell who have recently qualified as Junior Umpires.

## Essex and Wales—Four Titles each



Cippenham Young Players' Summer Festival



Despite a number of late withdrawals because of a clash with a national training camp, there was another bumper entry of about 300 for the ever popular Cippenham Young Players' Summer Festival. Billed as a 1-star open, this event has always attracted a vast number of players from far and wide and keeps organizers Ken Phillips and Jan Chapman and seventeen tables very busy for a whole weekend.

Gone are the days when Cippenham players used to dominate their own junior open events. In the absence of Eddie Mitchell, nursing a broken wrist, only Jonathan Evans made it onto the podium when finishing as runner-up to Lewis Williams in the Under-14 Boys' Singles.

Williams was the most successful player of the weekend and was the only player to win two events. His other conquest was in the U12 Boys'

Singles where he defeated his Welsh colleague Jonathan Tann.

The other six events were won by six different players but that was where the sharing out finished. Wins for Chloe Thomas over Evangeline Collier in the U16 Girls' Singles and for Taylor Williams over Natasha Walsh in the U14 Girls' Singles resulted in half of the eight titles travelling west along the M4 into the principality of Wales.

The other four titles travelled in the opposite direction along the M4 and M25 into the county of Essex. Collier avenged her earlier defeat by Thomas to claim the U18 Girls' Singles while Estelle Purkis beat county colleague Danielle Whealy in the U12's. Essex claimed their equal share by taking the top two boys' events: the U18 when Emran Hussain beat Reece Tan in an all-Essex final and the U16's where Tan gained his victory over Hampshire's Nathan Bingham.

## Cippenham Third in Unofficial National Rankings

Every year we do an analysis of English clubs' positions in the various British leagues. It is a very simple system—if there are 48 teams in a league the team coming first is awarded 48 points, the team finishing second 47 and so on down to 1 for the bottom team. All divisions of the (senior) British League, Women's British League, Junior British League and Veterans' British League are taken into consideration.

Despite dropping two teams down to seven in 2007-8, we still managed to hold on to our unofficial position of the third most successful club in the country out of 106 in the survey.
