Champions of Europe—England cadet boys return home heroes

Europe Cadet Team Gold for Gavin and England

ippenham Table Tennis Club member Gavin Evans returned home from the European Youth Championships in Prague in July with a gold medal and a hugely enriched reputation. Only twelve years of age, and playing in an under-15 competition, Gavin still has a further three years left ahead of him and yet is already ranked the fourteenth best cadet player in Europe.

England won the team event for the first time since 1986 although in the singles they relied entirely on their top two European ranked cadets Paul Drinkhall and Darius Knight. Gavin played an unbeaten role in the doubles during the early matches partnering Drinkhall to victory in the 3-1 win over Slovakia and the 3-0 success over Portugal and then partnered Knight in the 3-1 victory over Russia. Gavin and Drinkhall were successful twice more in the last 16 match against Latvia and the quarter-final against Poland, both of which England won 3-0. For the semi-final 3-0 win over Germany and the same score success over the Czech Republic in the final England relied on the top two guns Drinkhall and Knight. However, the team victory gave Gavin a cherished gold medal.

Gavin's displays in the team event and his previous successful appearances on the international stage gave him a ranking of number fourteen in Europe

and a seeded position amongst the top sixteen. As a result he was given byes through the first two rounds of the singles event and then faced Damir Marinic of Bosnia-Herzegovina in round three. He progressed through that round 4-1 after losing the first game and then had another 4-1 win over Portugal's Diogo Pinho in the fourth round. This took Gavin into his allotted seeded position in the last sixteen where he had the misfortune to

come up against the third seed Tomas Tregler of Czech Republic and lost 4-0.

Tregler went out in the next round to Piotr Chodorski of Poland who gave Paul Drinkhall by far his sternest test in the semi-final, succumbing only 11-8 in the deciding seventh game. Drinkhall went on to beat his England team mate Darius Knight in the final.

he curtain was brought down on a successful 2004-5 season for Cippenham Table Tennis Club with the final event of the campaign on 3rd July. Players from as far afield as Wales travelled for the Cippenham Veterans' 2-Star Open Champion-ships. It proved another successful event for the 52 competitors, organised by Club Chairman Graham Trimming and refereed by Mick Strode.

The Men's Singles, pronounced by the organizers beforehand as being wide open, did not disappoint. Top seed Chris Pickard was displaced into second place in his preliminary round group. However, this was a particularly strong group eventually won by Derek Holman, twice Cippenham Veterans' Open champion in June 1997 and January 2002. Such was the strength in depth that Paul Elliott, one of the top players for Chalfont in the Slough League in the season just finished, finished last out of six in this group with only one win, that against Andrew Misseldine who finished third. The others in the group were Welshman Roger Grech, and Clive Banham who went on to win the consolation event.

Second seed Fred Dove, winner of the event in January 2004, did manage to win his group but had to recover from two games down in his first match against John Barnes. As a result of

his loss to Holman, Pickard ended up in the bottom half of the draw and then beat Dove in round two. One round more and both the top seeds were out as Steve Davis got the better of Pickard 12-10 in the fifth and deciding In the third quarter Tony Needham was making good progress, eliminating Geoff Grange and Richard Burton before falling to the power of Davis in the semi-final.

Holman, now at the top of the draw had a fairly straight-forward passage to the final by comparison. Delighted at the way he was playing, for the very first time in spectacles, Holman saw off the last Cippenham club hope Mike Rhodes in round two and then beat Joel Clancy 3-0 and Dave Adamson 3-1 to set up a final show down with his Graham Spicer Club team-mate Davis. provide two home victories in as many weeks. Gavin Evans wins the cadet boys' title and Melanie Farquhar the junior girls' title.

Gavin also wins gold in the individual event at the Six Nations Cadet Championships is Germany. Brother Myles also represents England in this event.

Graham Trimming, founder of the Club in 1973 and General Secretary ever since, becomes Chairman for the first time.

June
