Hungarian Rhapsody for Cippenham Five



ive Cippenham members returned recently from Budapest, Hungary after representing their countries in the European Youth Championships. The Evans brothers, Bradley and Gavin, had to sit it out on the bench in the cadet boys' team event. Their team came back with the silver medals after just losing out to France after being 2-0 up in the final but such was the form of England's top duo Paul Drinkhall (Middlesbrough) and Darius Knight (London) that neither brother was asked to take to the table. Indeed, Drinkhall's form was so good that it earned him a number one seeded position in the individual singles event.

Cippenham's three other representatives did play a major part for their teams, though. Joanna Parker was the most successful player in England's junior girls' team, winning seven of her ten matches. After starting slowly with 3-0 defeats against Romania and France, England then beat Slovakia 3-0, Croatia 3-2, lost to Serbia & Montenegro 1-3, beat Belgium 3-0 and Netherlands 3-2 before losing the final match to Russia 2-3. This put the team in tenth position overall. Jo did especially well to win both her matches against the Netherlands, these being crucial in the 3-2 result.

Melanie Farquhar, having forced her way into the England cadet girls' team late in the season, may not have expected to be ever present but she was, despite the team not having the best of results. Mel commenced the tournament in brilliant form by winning her first match against Hungary. However, this match was sub-



sequently lost 3-1 and was followed by more losses against Poland, Ukraine, Bosnia & Herzegovina, Lithuania, Portugal and Slovenia. Only Switzerland were beaten, 3-2 thanks to two wins from Mel who obtained three wins from nine matches as the team finished 24th.

David Hayes, the current Slough and Buckinghamshire Men's Singles champion, was playing for Ireland, having gained qualification through his paternal grandfather. He played in all five of his team's matches winning two of his five singles including one in the only victory over Iceland.

Joanna Parker progressed the furthest in the individual singles events. After two byes, due to her seeded position, she then beat Maria Morozova (Estonia) before being defeated by the Spaniard Sara Ramirez 4-2 in the last thirty-two.

In the Cadet Boys' Singles Gavin Evans reached the third round after a bye and a

win against Peter Sebestyen (Hungary) but succumbed to Slav Jovanovic (Austria) but with four more years in this age group the brightest talent in English, and possibly European, table tennis will have plenty more chances. His older brother Bradley, after a bye, lost to Laurent Kintzele (Luxembourg) in round two.

A similar fate befell Melanie Farquhar who lost to K. Grzybowska (Poland) and David Hayes was a first round faller to Admir Mujabasic (Bosnia).

Bradley had a good run through to the fifth round of the consolation event with wins over Dejan Pupcevic (Slovenia), P. Chojnowski (Poland), Jonas Nilseng (Norway) and V. Agurjanovs (Latvia) before losing out to Gencay Menge (Turkey), ranked 14 in Europe. Gavin beat K. Sternberg (Denmark) before being beaten by Bojan Crepulja (Serbia). Melanie, after a bye, lost to Aude Leseur (France) while David was a first round loser to Eleftheri Makras of Greece.

Veterans' Summer Open

Cippenham Table Tennis Club's final event of the season, the Veterans' Summer 2-Star Open, produced a thrilling climax in the Men's Singles event. Welshman Steve Hall, winner of the corresponding event last year, beat the 2002 winner Dave Harvey 11-7 in the fifth game of the final after coming back from two games to one down. Tight matches were the order of the day for the unorthodox Hall including 11-9 in the fifth game in his first group match against Terry Boxall.

For ETTA National Development Manager and once top 75 England man Diccon Gray, this was his comeback tournament and he proved to be a dark horse. Recently signed to play for Cippenham in the Veterans' British League next season, Diccon beat the January tournament's winner Fred Dove in his group, and then beat Tony Needham and seventh seed Holman before falling to top seed Hall in the quarters. The other top Cippenham player Paul Baker went one better after taking the place of absent third seed David Harding. Paul won his group and then progressed to the semi-final with wins over Hegedus and Banham (11-8 in the fifth) before succumbing to Harvey.

February

David Hayes and his mother Sue win the Men's and Women's Singles at the Bucks Closed as Cippenham players take another clean sweep.

All the major titles at the Slough



Closed come the way of Cippenham players. David Hayes is dominant in most events including Men's Singles and as Sue takes the Women's Singles it becomes a double double for the Hayes household of Bucks and Slough titles.

Cippenham's girls' B team take the Junior British League Division 2 title with Melanie Farquhar finishing with a 90% record. Cippenham's other three teams occupy lower positions.

The veteran men's team maintain their third position in Division 1 of the Veteran's British League during the final stages.

March

The Club is awarded Senior Club of the Year for the first time at the Mayor of Slough's Annual



Sports Awards while Graham Trimming gets Service to Sport for a second time and David Hayes' great season is rewarded with Junior Sportman of the Year.

The Bucks junior team of five Cippenham players have a fantastic time in the final weekend of the County Championships Junior Premier Division eventually finishing as runners-up.

The Club secures its record 20th Slough League championship and 11th in succession. Divisions 2 and 3 titles are also won for a treble unique in Slough League history. David Hayes, James Milton, Mark Banks and Laurence Orton all complete the season unbeaten. Both British League teams are successful in the final weekend and secure fourth places in their divisions.

June

Melanie Farquhar makes her England debut in the Six Nations Cadet Tournament. Bradley and Gavin Evans are members of the England boys' team that wins their section.

Gavin Evans surpasses all previous records with five titles at the English U10/11/12/13 National Championships. He shares the doubles titles with

brother Myles and Edward Mitchell. Eddie and Katie Rule are runners-up in the U10BS and U12GS respectively.
