# Good Start for Women at Cheltenham

cippenham TTC made an excellent start to the Women's British League Premier Division campaign at Cheltenham during the first weekend in September. Winning four matches and drawing the fifth has left them equal top of their section with excellent prospects for the final weekend at the same venue in January.

Newcomer Marina Zarzycka was the star of the show with eight wins out of ten matches and she was ably supported by Gemma Chapman and Lesley Keast who had seven successes each.

The first opponents to succomb were Wirral 5-1 with only Lesley dopping a singles while next were BATTS Team Peniel (Harlow) who were beaten 4-2. In this match Cippenham lost the first and last sets while Marina remained unbeaten. Grove 2nds were then beaten by the same score with Lesley bagging a brace. On the Sunday Guernsey were put to the sword in a 6-0 hammering that left the final game for the weekend against the top seeds Irish Ladies who included two strong Chinese players. The match ended in a hard fought 3-3 draw with each Cippenham player recording one win. In this match Marina became the only player to inflict defeat upon Jing Yi Gao all weekend.

Grove I lead the way in the Red section of the Premier Division while China Fleet (Devon) and Woodfield are only slightly adrift.

#### Another Gold for Joanna

Cippenham member Joanna Parker won another gold medal to add to her illustrious collection when, in Largs during the period 19-21 September, she was part of a strong England women's team that won the 30<sup>th</sup> Home Countries International Championships. In the Women's Singles event Joanna reached the semi-final stage before bowing out to eventual winner Helen Lower.

#### Gareth Beaten

Cippenham's Gareth Herbert lost to Dimitrij Mazunov as England went down 3-0 to a very strong Russia side in the European League in September.

#### Rascals Withdrawn

Regretably, the Club has had to withdraw the Cippenham Rascals team from Division 3 of the Slough League. Lack of personnel and an absence of someone willing to captain the team led to this decision. The two players originally allocated to this team have been re-allocated: Georgia Veneer to Scoundrels and Catherine Hayes to Vagabonds.

# BOTH TEAMS MAKE GOOD STARTS IN THE BRITISH LEAGUE

Both of Cippenham's British League teams acquitted themselves well during the first weekend of matches, played at their home venue, 13-14 September. The first team ended with five points and in fourth position in Division 1 South while the seconds gained one less point but nevertheless finished one place higher in Division 2 South. Both divisions were very keenly contested and Division 2 produced seven drawn matches out of the twelve that did not feature runaway leaders London Progress III. Indeed, all but one of the matches Cippenham contested finsihed either 4-4 or 5-3.

New signing Terry Haley, who played last season for Horsham, lost only one of his eight matches from the number four position in the first team. Mark Butler won four while Martin Adams and Clive Payne scored three each; all team members contributing vital wins in close matches.

The second team was buoyed by the performances of two players who have emerged from the Club's coaching programme. David Hayes (15) won six out of eight while Robert Hansell (19) won five. Mark Jackson. Robert Lemon and Paul Baker also made telling contributions.

Saturday was a good day for Cippenham with only one point being dropped. Sunday, on the other hand, saw only two points earned from a possible eight.

The first team kicked off with a 5-3 win over Ellenborough, a result which proved to be the only occasion when the north London side failed to win all weekend. Mark and Terry both score maximums in this match while Clive had an exceptional 14-12 fifth game success over England number 20 ranked Eric Hammond. Another 5-3 followed against EBS-Orange Northampton I with Terry once again bagging a brace. This time he was supported by two from Martin and one from Clive.

Maybe it was hangovers from Saturday's results, but Sunday morning brought disappointment with a 3-5 reverse against Reading rivals OLOP IMPACT. Terry again won his two, against Rob Pountney and Hari Gehlot, but the only other win was gained by Clive, also over Pountney, when the match was already lost. Mark regained his form for the afternoon match against London Progress II and his two

wins were supplemented by one each from Terry and Martin in a 4-4 draw.

4-4 London Progress II 4-4 Generation 2

The second team also started well with a 6-2 win over Guildford I. David and Robert Hansell won two each while Mark and Rob Lemon sealed the victory with a win apiece. The same four players won one each in the afternoon's 4-4 draw with north Essex side NETTS.

Perhaps the second team had been drinking from the same cup as the first team for on Sunday morning they, too, suffered their only defeat. David Hayes was outstanding for his two wins but one from Robert Hansell was not enough as Mark and Paul fired blanks. Both made amends in the 4-4 draw with Fareham based Generation 2 as all four scored in a match that Cippenham had slightly the better of.

#### Ser vice Law Changes

All players need to be aware of a further change to the service law this season. It is now required that the free arm be immediately withdrawn from the area between the server's body and the net. It is no longer sufficient for the ball not to be hidden from the receiver, although this also still applies.

The law is reproduced in full below.

#### A GOOD SERVICE

- Service shall start with the ball resting freely 2.6.1 on the open palm of the server's stationary free hand.
- 2.6.2 The server shall then project the ball near vertically upwards, without imparting spin, so that it rises at least 16cm after leaving the palm of the free hand and then falls without touching anything before being struck.
- 2.6.3 As the ball is falling the server shall strike it so that it touches first his court and then, after passing over or around the net assembly, touches directly the receiver's court; in doubles, the ball shall touch successively the right half court of server and receiver.
- 2.6.4 From the start of service until it is struck, the ball shall be above the level of the playing surface and behind the server's end line, and it shall not be hidden from the receiver by any part of the body or clothing of the server or his doubles partner; as soon as the ball has been projected, the server's free arm shall be removed from the space between the server's body and the net.
- It is the responsibility of the player to serve so that the umpire or the assistant umpire can see that he complies with the requirements for a good service.
- 2.6.5.1 If the umpire is doubtful of the legality of a service he may, on the first occasion in a match, declare a let and warn the server.
- 2.6.5.2 Any subsequent service of doubtful legality of that player or his doubles partner will result in a point to the receiver.
- 2.6.5.3 Whenever there is a clear failure to comply with the requirements for a good service, no warning shall be given and the receiver shall score a point.
- 2.6.6 Exceptionally, the umpire may relax the requirements for a good service where he is satisfied that compliance is prevented by physical disability.

#### **Explanation**

"The space between the server's body and the net" is the imaginary vertical four-sided column defined by the farthest parts of the net posts and the 2 parts of the server's trunk (= body except head, legs and arms) being farthest left and farthest right relating to his end line.
