Caroline and David Fly the Flag at the Junior Open

The host club's duo David Hayes and Caroline Linz were the winners at the Cippenham Junior 2-Star Open Table Tennis Championships on Easter Saturday. This is the fourth year in a row that both titles have remained at Cippenham and one has to look back to the first running of the tournament in 1997 for the only time that the Girls' Singles has eluded the Club.

The final of the Boys' Singles was contested by the top two seeds with David coming from a game down to wrest the title from Marc Armstrong. After winning his preliminary round group David beat Lee Mullett, Cippenham colleague Ashley Shaw and, in the semi-final, Michael Harvey to set up the final show down with Marc, another player who trains at Cippenham. After winning his group, Marc beat Andrew Gross, Alex Kearley and Chris Buck. Ashley Shaw was joined in the quarter-finals by his brother Oliver but he became a victim of Harvey. Other Cippenham players to make it through their groups were Prabdeep Panesar and Sebastian Bielec.

In the Girls' Singles, Caroline Linz took her first title by beating surprise finalist Carley Roper. Roper had a good win in the quarters over Sarah Hubbard and then dismissed Lisa Standen in the semis. Caroline defeated Alison Woodland in her semi after the Sussex girl had secured an unexpected win over home

player Sylvana Bielec. Sylvana had also lost her second-seed position when beaten by Standen in the preliminary group.

There was more joy for the home club when 10-years old Katie Rule won the Girls' Consolation in an all-Cippenham

battle with the more established Jenny Hansell. Katie had also beaten another older Cippenham player, Catherine Hayes, sister of the boys' champion, in the semi-final. The Boys' Consolation went to John McBeath of Hampshire.

Gemma Finishes Fifth

Cippenham's Gemma Chapman performed creditably, finishing fifth, at the National Junior Masters held at her home club the first weekend in April. The only players to beat her were three members of the England women's team, just returned from the European Championships in Italy, and Kate Steward from Somerset. On day one, Saturday, Gemma won five of her seven matches including a 11-8 in the fifth win over Karen Shepherd from Cheshire, but who nevertheless teams up for Cippenham with Gemma in the Junior British League. Gemma's losses were against England stars Joanna Parker, herself a former Cippenham player, and Kelly Sibley. Gemma therefore qualified for the Sunday matches where she picked up another

four wins, including a good 11-8 in the fifth victory over the higher ranked Lauren Springthorpe and lost only to the eventual winner Georgina Walker and Steward.

Cippenham had two other players competing in the girls' event and one in the boys'. Emily Tucker proved the most successful and although she finished bottom of the twelve finalists she qualified for the second day's play with a fantastic win over Lauren Springthorpe. Emily also beat Sarah Brown and Kendall Smith. In the other group Melanie Farquhar found the going tough and could not muster a win and Robert Lemon also failed to qualify from his group.

Mark is the Master Again

Mark Banks retained his Slough Masters title in a thrilling final against his Cippenham Pirates team - mate James Milton at Burnham Table Tennis Club on 29th April. The two finalists celebrated their team's success in becoming Slough League champions by dominating a field that had qualified by virtue of their performances in the League this season.

Melanie is the Pick at the Cadet Masters

The second of the two National Masters tournaments was played at Cippenham during the weekend of 12/13 April. This major event, for which players have qualified through county, then regional and finally national trials, featured the best cadet (U15) players in England. Of the thirty-two qualifiers, sixteen boys and sixteen girls, an incredible eight were supplied by the host club, demonstrating once again that Cippenham is one of the power houses of English table tennis.

The most successful Cippenham player was Bradley Evans, now based at the National Academy in Nottingham. Bradley finished fifth, one place below his national ranking and lost only to the four players who finished above him. The deciding factor in his final position came on the first day when Bradley succumbed 12-10 in the deciding game to Durham's David Meads. That proved enough for Meads to take fourth place away from Bradley. The top three players were in a class of their own but the final positions were not in the order of current national ranking. Top ranked Darius Knight finished only third behind Tim Yarnall and the winner Paul Drinkhall.

Cippenham's other survivor from the first day, David Hayes, was unlucky to feature in a three-way tie for sixth place and was eventu-

ally placed eighth on count-back. The new Slough League Men's Singles champion lost 11-6 in the fifth against both the boys involved in the count-back but, as all three matches involving the three went into a fifth and deciding game, it was points ratio that finally decided the positions. The other two Evans brothers, Gavin and Myles, failed to qualify for the second day's play. Gavin disappointed in beating only Myles while the older of the two beat Yorkshire's Ben Barlow and David Hayes.

Of the girls, Melanie Farquhar was by far the most successful and improved upon her ranking by seven places to finish seventh. After the Saturday matches, Melanie was third in her group after benefiting from a three-way tie in which she

was placed top. Melanie carried her impressive form into Sunday and, in all, won seven matches and lost five. One of the losses, at 13-11 in the fifth, to Sarah Perks on Saturday cost her two places in the final analysis. Cippenham's Rebecca Tweedy also qualified for the second day's play with three wins on Saturday, but finished bottom in twelfth place. Caroline Linz and Sylvana Bielec failed to survive the first day despite the latter having an incredible 10-5 lead, at 1-1 in games, over Kelly Sibley, the eventual winner and part of England's senior team for the recent European Championships.

All three Cippenham players representing England in the British Primary Schools' Championship at Blackburn in April had good results, especially Gavin Evans who won gold medals in both the team and individual events. The precocious nine year old, now based with his family in Nottinghamshire, led his England team to 10-0 victories over Scotland, Ireland, Isle of Man and Guernsey and 9-1 over Wales to secure the team gold. His older brother Myles was also in the England team, dropping just one set to Wales. In the Boys' Singles the two brothers rather unfortunately met in the semi-final and Gavin went on to beat another England player Billy Deville in the final.

Ten years-old Katy Rule followed in her brother Martin's footsteps with her call up to the England cause. Katy lost only once as England took the team silver behind Ireland and then was unfortunate to meet her Irish opponent again in the quarter-final of the Girl's Singles.
